SLIP COVERS FOR LAMP SHADES . . . If you have a soiled lamp shade and cannot obtain a new shade, try making a "slip cover" using patterned paper of a light color, or cotton cloth (gingham, percale, chambray). Lay the material on the lamp shade, and mark the shape to be cut out. Then sew or past the edges together and finish with a simple edging or trimming. Slip the new shade over the old shade.



DUST STEALS LIGHT... Dust and dirt collecting on lamp bulbs, reflector bowls, and fixtures will often absorb as much as 50 per cent of the light. To get all the light you pay for, clean lamp bulbs and fixtures frequently, also sloor and table lamps. Wipe lamp bulbs and bowls with a damp cloth, and be sure lamp bulbs are dry before screwing back in socket. A soft tirush can be used for dusting lamp shades.
