


Bands May Visit Camp

The Farmington Board of Education has given reluctant consent to participation by high school musicians in summer band camps this year.

President Richard Peters said it was possible the youngsters would return to find bands eliminated from next year's activities unless new school millage is voted.

The district in the past has provided bus transportation for the young people. Transportation costs for this year's outing by musicians from three high schools was estimated at "something less than \$1,000," by Marjorie VanAmeyde, assistant superintendent for instruction.

Peters said school Booster Clubs will be contacted to see whether they might be willing to underwrite transportation costs.

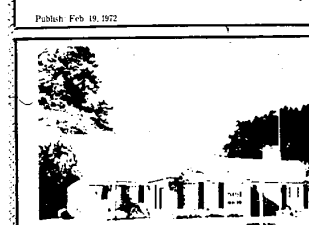

To comply with section 8-01 of the Public Act of 1968, Senate version 121 of the Compiled Laws of 1968 and section 7-2 of Act 27 of the Public Act of 1970, Senate version 177-2 of the Compiled Laws of 1970, the State Boundary Commission will hold a public hearing on the proposed annexation of certain territory, copies of the map and legal description can be obtained by writing the State Boundary Commission situated in Novi Township by the City of Novi and will receive information and testimony on the following:

1. Population.
2. Population density.
3. Land area.
4. Land use.
5. Services and utilities.
6. Topography.
7. Natural boundaries and drainage basins.
8. Past and probable future urban growth, including population increase and business, commercial and industrial development in the area.
9. Comparative data for the annexing municipality, and the remaining portion of the unit from which the area will be detached shall be compared.
10. Need for separate community services.
11. Present cost and adequacy of governmental services in the area to be annexed.
12. The probable future needs for services.
13. Practicalities of supplying such services in the area to be annexed.
14. Probable effect of the proposed annexation and of alternative courses of action on the cost and adequacy of services in the area to be annexed and on the remaining portion of the unit from which the area will be detached.
15. Probable increase in taxes in the area to be annexed in relation to the benefits expected to accrue from annexation.
16. Financial ability of the annexing municipality to maintain urban type services in the area.
17. General effect upon the entire community of the proposed action.
18. Relationship of the proposed action to any established city, village, township, county or regional land plan.

The Boundary Commission will not reach any conclusions or make any determinations until after the March 1, 1972, public hearing. The Commission has several options available. They can deny the petition, approve it as submitted or approve it with boundary adjustments.

Vagnozzi Challenges His Critic

FARMINGTON
Irrked by a longtime critic's claim that Farmington Board of Education spends school money foolishly, Trustee Aldo Vagnozzi has offered to resign if the accuser can prove his charges.

"If he can't, he'll have to carry out his part of the bargain by starting to tell the truth about this district," Vagnozzi said.

The challenge was put to

Bruce Duke, ultra-conservative school board gadfly and member of the John Birch Society, who shows up at nearly all school board meetings equipped with a tape recorder. Duke said later that he accepted the challenge.

Duke's statements "sound like we're deliberately mispending money," Vagnozzi said. "There's an implication of something close to illegal" in board actions.

Vagnozzi, who cheerfully conceded his offer was "somewhat of a grandstand play," said it extends beyond Duke to accusations made by "MOTOREDE, the John Birch Society or any other front group they organize."

William Prisk, school business administrator, said it was Duke's claims which were irresponsible, rather than the district's spending.
