

Old Favorites Turn Into New Plants

Want to be first with the newest and the best? Try some of the new for '72 flowers and vegetables that are on the market for the first time this year.

The All - America Award winners are improved varieties of old favorites. They have been tested and compared in trial gardens all over the country and proved superior.

Look for zinnia "Carved Ivory." It is two feet tall with creamy colored quill - type flowers nearly six inches across.

"Circus" petunia has full double flowers of salmon and white that are as gay as a circus tent. They really give a whirling pin - wheel effect.

"Summer Carnival" hollyhock has large double flowers on five foot stalks. The bright flowers are produced the first year from seed.

"Gold Galore" is the latest in marigolds -- 18 to 24 inches tall with large orange - gold flowers. It's called a hedge type, and the upright bushy plants will be smothered with blooms from mid - summer to frost.

"Apollo" and "Portrait" are 1972 All - America rose winners. "Apollo" is a pale clear yellow and is reputed to be thornless.

Imagine that! "Portrait" is a blending of rich warm pink tones and has a delightful fragrance. It is highly disease - resistant.



"PORTRAIT" is a hybrid tea rose that was an award winner in the All - America Rose Selections.



"APOLLO" takes its name from a mighty Greek god, and it was a winner in the 1972 All - America Rose Selections.

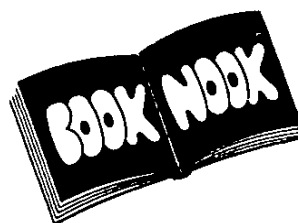

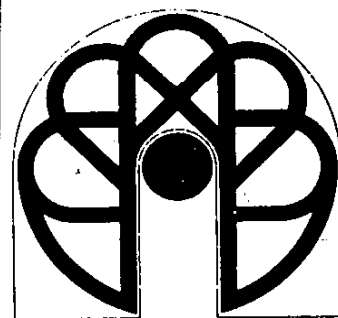
