The Michigan flier is a member of the Third Bombardment Division, cited by the President for its new historic England-Africa shuttle bombing of Messerschmitt plants at Regensburg, Germany.

Private William H. Lewis of Farmington, is a member of the Military Police Company which boasts close to 600 Nazi aircraft destroyed on operations into enemy held territory. In addition numerous ground installations have been blasted and hundreds

of German vehicles strafed and divebombed.
 Pvt. Lewis' unit is not only charged with the security of this VIII Fighter Command Station, but also regulates the vehicular traffic on the perimeter of the field. Having been trained more thoroughly in infantry tactics than any other air base unit, an MP company stands ready to defend the base should the occasion arise. The base is located in England.
