Motion made by Bagnall and supported by Johnson that David C. Allen of 14231 Trinity Avenue, Detroit, 23, Michigan, be given the right to operate a taxi service in the City of Farmington under the rules and regulations now set up in the City of Detroit. Carried, all years.

Motion made by Bagnall and supported by Hinger that the City cash in the two five thousand (\$5,000.00) dollar United States Treasury Third War Loan Bonds known as 7/8% Certificates of Indebtedness, Series "E", 1944 payable September 1, 1944 and that authority be given to purchase four five thousand (\$5,000.00) dollar United States Treasury Sixth War Loan Bonds known as 7/8% Certificates of Indebtedness, Series H, payable December 1, 1945. To the qualified school electors of School District No. 5, Frc., City and Township of Farmington.
Concurring with similar action of the Oakland County Board of Education, the Board of Education of District No. 5 Frc., City and Township of Farmington hereby issues a call for a special election for the purpose of submitting the question, "SHALL FARMINGTON TOWNSHIP BE ORGANIZED INTO A SINGLE SCHOOL DISTRICT?" (YES, () NO, as provided under Act 319, P. A. 1937, and Act 137, P. A. 1935, as amended. Said election for the electors in School District No. 5 Frc., City and Township of Farmington to be held in the Gymnasium-Auditorium in the City of Farmington on Monday, the 27th day of November, 1944 between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m., E.W.T.

It is not necessary to be a registered voter in order to vote in this special election. The only qualifications for voting on this occasion are as follows:

1. Must be a citizen of the United States.
2. Must be 21 years of age (either male or female).
3. Must have a three months residence in the school district immediately prior to the election.
4. Must either own property which is assessed for school taxes in the school district where he resides, or be the parent or legal guardian of a child of the age of 5 to 19 years inclusive.
