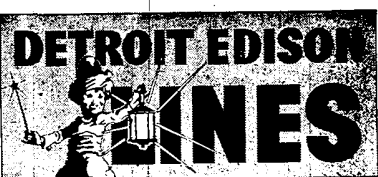

CHRISTMAS COOKIES. For youngsters—and oldsters, too—a Christmas recipe from our Home Service Department:

English Christmas Cookies
1/2 cup butter
1 egg
2 cups baking powder
1 cup brown sugar
1 1/2 cups sifted bread flour
Top decoration:
1 tsp. cinnamon
2 cups Granulated sugar
Egg white
Blanched almonds if sliced, or cake confetti or colored sugar

Cream butter, add sugar gradually, then well beaten egg and the flour and baking powder sifted together. Place in refrigerator overnight. (This dough may also be sliced or rolled out to 1/4-inch thickness or cut in fancy shapes; sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar and arrange nuts on top.) Put through cookie press onto sheets. Brush tops with egg white, sprinkle with cinnamon and sugar. You may use colored sugar or cake confetti, if desired. Time, 12-15 minutes. Temperature, 375-400° F.
