Remove Spots From Wall
 Don't throw up your hands in despair when you see greasy spots just above the doorpost or hand prints on the wall. These stains can be removed with a paste made of Fuller's earth, or any other dry absorbing material, and some grease solvent, such as alcohol, tetrachloride. However, before attempting to remove spots and stains of the wall-paper, it would be wise for the homeowner to test a small area of the paper in an inconspicuous place. A paste of the solvent and either cornstarch, white cornmeal, talcum powder, salt or Fuller's earth should be spread over the spot, allowed to dry, and then rubbed out. Repeat the process until the stain disappears. If the spot does not contain grease, water may be used as the solvent instead of tetrachloride.

Disease Treatment
 Rapid treatment centers—the special hospitals for the intensive treatment of venereal disease—have helped solve wartime industrial manpower problems in critical areas by returning large numbers of workers to their jobs promptly. The U. S. Public Health Service Venereal Disease Division, Federal Security Agency, reported. Approximately 100,000 patients a year, in all walks of life, are treated in the nation's network of rapid treatment centers, the division reported. Based on information from some of the largest of the 61 centers in operation, the division estimated that about a third of the patients in the centers have industrial employment background. The division reported that information from the centers indicated that all but a few patients employed previously in industry have returned to industrial jobs.

Lay Groundwork
 "Today cranes, derricks, bulldozers, concrete mixers, cement trucks, nuts, bolts and all other thousands of peacetime construction items have gone to war," comments a Army and Navy release. "Just as American men have stepped into uniform—so also has peacetime construction equipment taken on its uniform of olive drab or camouflage paint. Instead of being used to build peacetime equipment, the peacetime construction equipment is now employed to build fighter ships, docks, ammunition dumps, ship repair facilities, and those other essentials necessary to support the land, sea and air forces. Planes, ships, guns and tanks are the glamorous side of this war. They make the headlines, but behind them are the bulldozers and rock crushers and harbor dredges that must lay the ground work in order that these fighting arms can deliver their blows."

Frequent Fires
 There's a dwelling fire every 1 1/2 minutes, a farm fire every 7 1/2 minutes, a mercantile fire every 8 minutes, and a factory fire every 10 minutes in the United States. The 10 most common causes of serious fires are a carelessly discarded cigarette or match; defective electrical equipment; overloaded or defective heating equipment, chimneys and flues; sparks on the roof; flammable liquids; rubbish; spontaneous ignition; children playing with matches, hot wires and coils; lack of fire-protection equipment.
