WASTE FATS COLLECTION SHOWS DECLINE

A strong appeal for increased home salvage of used kitchen fats was directed to Michigan homemakers today by Angus C. Doane, Michigan district representative of the War Food Administration.

"Used fat salvage has shown a sharp decline during the past few months," Doane said. "The figures disclose a continuing monthly decrease despite the premium for homemakers of two red points per pound of used fat authorized by the Office of Price Administration. With the increased need for fats for production of ammunition is increasing daily, Michigan is asked to contribute to its share."

Administration of the fat salvage program was transferred recently from the War Production Board to the War Food Administration, Doane said. "This change in responsibility does not affect local operation of the program," he explained. "Local fat salvage committee members continue to operate very much as they have in the past."

Doane referred to the statement recently issued by General Eisenhower appealing for "myriads of shells, guns, tires and planes for our fighting men," and General Somervell's declaration that arms and equipment production are lagging 40% behind schedules.

"Every item of equipment as called for by America's top military leaders requires fat either in its production or its operation," Doane declared. "Failure to meet these requirements can result in only one thing, and that is actual necessity for using more edible fats in the direct war effort, and thus reducing the supply of these now available for civilian consumption. We used to speak of every tabling of fat being important. Now every teaspoonful is vital to victory."
