HUGH SCHRAM WRITES ON YEAR'S OUTLOOK

(Continued from Page One) of supplying their families with appetizing meals, despite food shortages; of oleo on our dinner table and syrup in our coffee. "It will also be a year of men and women standing for hours in liquor lines; of more men and women browsing away more hours in beer gardens; of lax care of children and juvenile delinquency; of the great lack of manpower on the farms; of women doing the work of men in factories; of dissection between labor and capital; of rationing, and thousands of persons who take it on the chin in a manner which stalwart Americans should, because they realize that during every minute of the day there is a man dying in the struggle that is striving to achieve peace and happiness for the world. "The last war was fought to end wars and make the world safe for democracy, but it did not end wars, and it did not make the world safe for anything. Thousands of men gave their lives for a nihilistic cause, and thousands more have been lying in hospital beds these twenty-six years, since the end of that conflict. "This time the Axis powers will be crushed, to be sure, but they are intelligent people, and may rise to arms again. Whether or not we remain peaceful with Germany and Japan in future years will depend largely on the nature of the peace terms dictated by the allied leaders. We must choose their list of terms wisely and fairly. Also, a large dependence will be placed on the attitude of citizens of the future America. We, the college students of today, will be America's leaders of tomorrow, and we must find a way to maintain harmony in relations with foreign countries. "O God, we make this our prayer: Keep us from the debasements of war, from excess that makes life loathe and bitter; from drunkenness and various matters of lust that rot life; and from brutality, dishonor, and all things which make life coarse. Bring us very soon to a blessed reunion, where all the world's broken, bleeding hearts shall be healed. In Thy divine mercy, give us a light that we may find some way to preserve peace, joy, and fraternity on this earth."
