IT'S A WISE PARENT — Mollie Stevens Smart and Russell Cook Smart. This book, by two experts on child psychology, is directed to parents who want their children to grow to manhood and womanhood able to enjoy to the full everything that life has to offer. Dr. and Mrs. Smart contend that the happy, adaptable child who gets along with other children is the contented good citizen of the future. Although the steps to this goal vary with the individual, they are largely the responsibility of the young parents. If parents know how to guide their children along these steps, both parent and child will gain thereby.

"We think it worthwhile to write a book about children for parents

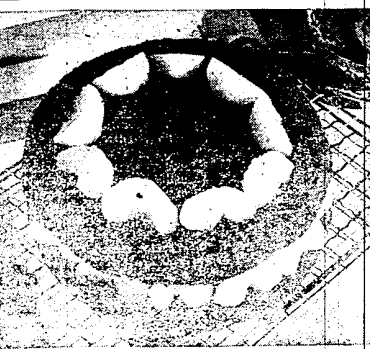
because children are always changing and facing their parents with something new," say the authors. They do not attempt to present ten easy steps, but offer instead general rules and pointers on being a better parent. The absence of technical language and the amusing fashion in which it is written make this book as readable as it is practical. Its helpful suggestions and sound advice on the successful rearing of children will be of value to every parent.

FRANCES WILLARD: From Prayers to Politics—Mary Earhart. Here in this warm and human biography is the real Frances Willard—the story of a charming, powerful, and far more interesting woman than the legendary saint created by her devoted followers. Famed W.C.T.U. leader, shrewd politician, busy journalist, able educator, organizer and slogan maker—she was all this, but she was also a woman with faults, failings, and foibles. This biography does not show her as less great but as more human.

As a child on the bleak Wisconsin farm, Frances Willard once exclaimed, "I wonder if we shall ever know anything, see anybody or go anywhere!" This girl was to become the first dean of the Women's College of Northwestern University, the national and international president of the W.C.T.U., a prominent figure in political controversies of the day, and the triumphant leader of the woman's suffrage movement. She is the only woman to have her statue placed in the Statuary Hall of the United States Capitol. Yet the effects of her lonely upbringing, her strict puritan upbringing, and the domination of a tyrannical father can be seen in her later life. Her tremendous drive for recognition and praise had to be fought with extreme shyness and sensitivity, which took many years to conquer. Her rebellion against old standards which made her the leader of the woman's revolution was always coupled with an emphasis on womanliness, on the home and the church, which brought her popularity with the men and women who laughed at more aggressive and "masculine" suffragettes.

AND THEY SHALL WALK: The Life Story of Sister Elizabeth Kenny—Kenny and Ontario. Sister Elizabeth Kenny is the Australian nurse who has brought a new and amazingly successful technique to the treatment of paralysis. In these pages, she has set down the thrilling record of a life which, in many of its aspects, has been a battle fought against forces entrenched in precedent and armored in tradition. She begins her story with the colorful picture of her early days at home in Australia—the beauty and joy of the open country and the gay comradeship of a lively household, filled with young people and friends. Interspersed are darker sketches of the savage atrocities with whom the young girl managed to keep on friendly terms, on one occasion being greatly aided in her treatment of a sick child by the arrival of a

Apple-Ginger Shortcake Is Winter Treat



Like baking snow and sleigh rides, apples and warm gingerbread are two things that go with cold winter evenings. Margorie Griffin, food editor of Carper's Farm, points out that the combination of the two foods gives a color-contrasting, sugar-saving Apple-Ginger Shortcake. She tells home-makers in the Country Cooking department of the magazine, read by 1,250,000 farm families.

Apple-Ginger Shortcake
1 1/2 c. shortening 1 tsp. baking powder
1/2 c. eggs, beaten 1 tsp. salt
1/2 c. light molasses 2 tsp. cinnamon
2 c. cake flour 1/2 c. boiling water
1/2 tsp. nutmeg
Cream the shortening and sugar thoroughly. Add eggs and beat well. Add molasses, then the sifted ingredients. Pour in water and beat until smooth. Bake in 2 greased 8-inch round pans at 350° F. for 30 minutes. Peel, core and cut apples in eighths. Drop them in sirup made with equal parts of sugar and water. Cook gently until each piece is

transparent. Remove and drain on a plate. Put apple slices between layers and on top.
Another appetite-tempting winter eve dessert that's easy on the sugar ration is Cracker Pudding.

Cracker Pudding
1 qt. milk 6 tsp. graham cracker
1 egg, beaten 1/2 tsp. salt
Dash of nutmeg
Dash of salt
Scald the milk and add finely rolled cracker crumbs. Let cool and add eggs and salt. Pour into custard cups or baking dish. Set in pan of hot water and bake in a moderate oven (325°) for 30 minutes. Serve with Lemon Cream Sauce.
Lemon Cream Sauce
2 eggs 1/2 c. lemon juice
1/2 c. sugar 1/2 c. water
1 tsp. cornstarch 1/2 c. cream
Dash of salt 1/4 tsp. nutmeg
Beat egg yolks. Add to those the sifted sugar, cornstarch and salt. Stir in lemon juice and water and cook over hot water until thickened. Chill, add cream and stiffly beaten egg whites. Sprinkle with grated rind and nutmeg. Serves 6.

group of half-naked warriors, one of whom acted as their messenger for help.

For, very early in life, Sister Kenny had begun her work of nursing—with particular interest in the treatment of paralysis. Later, at the outbreak of the first World War, she took her place with her country's forces, was wounded on the Western Front and made many voyages on hospital ships between the war zones and Australia.

No reader will set the book down without feeling something which borders on envy in this story of a colorful and eventful life, crowned with achievement and giving promise of still greater advances in medical discoveries along the road where she has so courageously plodded.

Boards will issue fivepound canning sugar coupons. No ration stamps in war ration book four will be good for canning sugar this year. For canning fruits and fruit juices, the allowance will be on the basis of one pound for each four quarts to be canned. The total allowance must not exceed 20 pounds a person, or 160 pounds to a single family, even though the family may contain more than eight persons.

Cotton Goods for Smaller Towns
Distribution of the 10,000,000 yards of cotton goods that is being made available for the first quarter of 1945 to merchants in rural areas has been limited to merchants who, in 1944, received less than 20 per cent of their 1943 sales of cotton goods, the War Production Board reports. The allocation of the cotton goods was made specifically for over-the-counter sale to persons who live in small towns and rural areas and who usually purchase such goods
