Wenzell was director of pupil personnel services and special education for the Livonia School District from 1961-65. He was also a visiting lecturer at Eastern Michigan University during the same period.

WENZELL, 44, is a native of Evanston. He joined the WIU faculty in November 1966, after having served as executive associate for mental retardation, Arizona State Hospital, 1965-66; and director of the division of special education, Arizona Department of Public Instruction, 1965, both in Phoenix.

Wenzell also has taught in the Minneapolis public schools and has held administrative posts in Skokie, Ill., and Southbury, Conn., public schools.

He received his BS degree in special education from the University of Wisconsin, his MA degree in guidance and counseling of the handicapped from Columbia University, and Ph.D. in special education from the University of Connecticut.

He has done post-doctoral study at the University of Michigan, University of Arizona, University of Minnesota, and University of Kansas - Menninger Foundation.

Wenzell was a U.S. Fulbright Research Scholar in New Zealand, 1959-60, during which time he served as a consultant to the New Zealand

Ministry of Education and also represented the National Assn. for Retarded Children and the International Assn. for the Rehabilitation of the Disabled.

HE is a life member of the Council for Exceptional Children, a fellow of the American Assn. on Mental Deficiency, and a member of the American Orthopsychiatric Assn.
