Temperature for Frost
The temperature of the object on which frost is deposited must be freezing (32 degrees F.) or below although frost will not actually be deposited at any temperature unless the "dew-point" is reached. On a still, clear night the temperature at the ground may fall several degrees lower than temperature at a moderate height above ground. Light frost may be expected, in general, in low-lying country or suburban localities having official weather bureau temperatures of about 40 degrees. Effect of pressure on the elevation above sea level has no appreciable influence on the formation of frost.

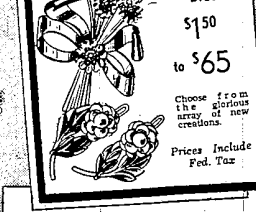
