 Unbaked pie shell 3 eggs
 1 cup milk 1/2 tsp. salt
 1 cup honey 1 tsp. vanilla
 Nutmeg

Beat eggs until light and foamy. Add honey, milk, salt and vanilla. Pour into unbaked pie shell and sprinkle with nutmeg. Bake for 30 minutes in a preheated, 425° F. oven.
