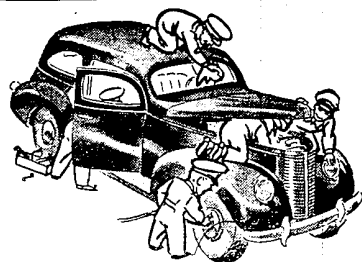

EIGHTH CHURCH DEDICATES PROPERTY



Eighth Church of Christ, Scientist, Detroit, held dedicatory services in the edifice at 20011 Grand River Avenue, corner Evergreen Road, Detroit, on Sunday, June 3, 1945. As Christian Science churches are only dedicated after the church property is fully paid for, this event marks the clearing of all debt on the property, including the site and edifice and an adjacent parking lot on Vaughan Avenue.

Three services were held, including an afternoon service in addition to the regular morning and evening services. A brief history of the church was read at each service.

Organized in 1931, Eighth Church was organized in 1931, and became a recognized branch of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, on September 10, 1933. The facilities of Redford High School were used for services and lectures during its early years, and free public Christian Science Reading Room was maintained at 17570 Lahser Road.

In 1937, property for a church building site was purchased, consisting of the entire block bounded by Grand River, Evergreen, Puritan and Vaughan Avenues. Although this property was part of a residential subdivision, all lot owners in the area gave written approval to its use for a Christian Science Church.

Ground for the new edifice was broken in February 1938, and erection of steel work began in April. The edifice, at 20011 Grand River Avenue, corner Evergreen Road, Detroit, on Sunday, June 3, 1945. A unique church design was made possible by the shape of the lot, enabling the architect, C. Wilbur Foster of Indianapolis, to plan it with the three main units on the same level; the main wing housing the church auditorium and foyer, another wing housing the Sunday School, with a smaller unit between these two accommodating the public Reading Room and service rooms. Installations include modern oil heating and air conditioning, also sound amplification to all rooms.

Obligations Paid
Regular and consistent contributions to the building and dedication funds by the members and congregation, in addition to a number of substantial gifts by persons who desire to remain anonymous, and by other Christian Science churches in Detroit, have made possible the dedication of Eighth Church at this time, for which sincere gratitude is expressed by its membership. The building completely equipped and furnished, including the site and adjacent parking lot, cost approximately \$205,000.00.
