Dear Editor and Staff: I am enclosing this letter in a letter to my folks, thanking you one and all for the hours of enjoyment I get from reading our home town paper. We servicemen from Farmington really appreciate every little consideration shown us. Again let me thank you.

A Local Boy, George H. Cooke, S/1c. The Cooke family were surprised to receive a telephone call from George, who had just pulled into port on the West Coast for repairs. George has been in action since October, and expects to go out again soon. He is 18, and the younger of the two Cooke sons in service. Stanley is at the Great Lakes Naval Hospital at the present time, under observation. George has been in the Navy a little over a year, and Stanley will have completed five years of Navy service on July 26. Anyone wishing to write either of the boys may obtain their addresses by calling 8711.

The greatest aerial troop movement in history is bringing three Michigan veterans back from their overseas stations in record time. Fifty thousand overseas returnees a month are being flown back by the ATC, and the bulk of them land at Miami Army Air Field, where a huge transport from Europe, Africa, Asia or South America lands every 45 minutes of the 24-hour day. Among those just returned is Pfc Thomas E. Tuck, 30, who served for 24 months in Europe, and was in the Anzio invasion. He has five stars on his campaign ribbon and a Distinguished Unit Citation. A tractor operator in civil life, he is the son of Horace Tuck, 27632 W. Eight Mile Road.

Robert J. Whisart, 22, of Route 4, Farmington, has been advanced to Storekeeper, third class, USNR.

Whisart entered the Navy in September, 1942, and is aboard a cruiser in the Western Pacific, on which he has taken part in nearly every major Naval operation from the Central Pacific to Okinawa in the summer of 1945. He wears nine battle stars for the 25 attacks in which he has participated since going into action for the first time in October, 1943. He served aboard this cruiser while she bombarded enemy shore installations, engaged in carrier task force and supported amphibious landings on Jap-held islands. He participated in the bombardment of Wake Island, then saw action in the Gilberts and Marshalls. From the Marshalls, he took part in the raids on Truk and Iey in the Carolinas, later serving in amphibious operations at Hollandia, New Guinea, and Salpau, Tini-an and Guam in the Marianas. Last December and January he landed during landings at Mindoro and Luzon, then participated in operations with carrier forces that swept daringly into the China Sea for raids on Hong Kong, Canton, Amoy, Camranh Bay, Saigon and Formosa. In February he took part in the two raids on Iwo Jima, and later in the month saw action when his cruiser supported carrier groups in the three-day air strike against Tokyo.

"You couldn't find better Jones" is a statement rarely heard about the Jones family, who are expected from the lips of fellow soldiers, but that's the reaction of soldiers upon return from the United States Riviera Recreation Area at Nice, France. Probably the most appreciated detachment of Marine Police in the U.S. Army, the 200 MPs stationed at Nice are all ex-combat soldiers, many wearing a cheerful of ribbons. They have been specially trained and instructed to watch over the welfare of the restees on the Riviera, without becoming too obtrusive. Pfc. Frank D. Barber, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Barber, 20209 Puntgrobok, is a member of this group.

Kenneth Thompson, son of Mrs. Nancy Thompson of Route 1, Farmington, has been promoted from technician fifth grade to technician fourth grade while serving with a veteran infantry outfit on Cebu. Overseas 30 months, Sgt. Thompson has seen service in Guadalcanal, the Fijian Islands, Bougainville, Leyte and Cebu. The Farmington veteran is entitled to wear the Combat Infantryman's Badge, the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign ribbon with two battle stars, and the Philippine Liberation ribbon with star. Sgt. Thompson is a member of the battle-tested 182nd Infantry, a regiment organized in colonial times and cited as the oldest American regiment in existence. The history of the regiment includes the names Bunker Hill, Bull Run, Meuse-Argonne, Guadalcanal and Bougainville.

Thanks again for the paper.

Casablanca is the hub of the airborne redeployment of troops from the European and Mediterranean theaters headed home. When the operation reaches its peak more than 1,300 troops per day will shuttle through the base, a total of approximately 40,000 per month.

Letters received last week by Mrs. Howard Westphal and Mrs. Bartha Westphal stated that Corporal Howard Westphal has been promoted to Staff Sergeant.

S/Sgt. Westphal is stationed with the 15th Army in Aachen, Germany. He participated in the Rhine battle. He has also been in France, Belgium, Holland and Germany. His latest letters, replete with his moving to Crochovakia as the British have taken over the occupation in Aachen.

Howard also was very happy with the packages he received on his 30th birthday, June 11, the gifts arriving right on his birthday.

He has written many interesting letters taken from his experiences since serving overseas. He has been living in a large estate which was once a palace of royalty. He tells of the Polish and Italian refugees doing their kitchen work, landscaping and all detail work which they are very grateful to do just to be free of the Nazi rule.

Howard would like to be remembered to his many friends at home, and states that he thinks of them often. His wife and son, Harry, reside at 23312 Farmington Road, and his mother at 33004 Grand River.
