TIN SALVAGE EFFORTS ARE REDOUBLED

Statements from high government officials that "tin salvaged from tin cans represents the margin of safety necessary in this previous waste" to continue fighting the Jap war in full strength" have prompted a request by Edwin J. Anderson, chairman of the State Salvage Committee of the Michigan Office of Civilian Defense, the county and local salvage chairmen redouble efforts on tin can salvage.

"On a nationwide basis housewives are saving approximately only 20 per cent of the tin cans they purchase," Anderson asserted. "Every step must be taken to halt this waste. Recent figures indicate that the country's stockpile of tin is at its lowest point since Pearl Harbor, and 88 per cent of the world's supply of native tin is still under control of the Japanese."

To stimulate collections and publicity in every Michigan community, salvage chairmen have been sent a kit of promotional material. Through posters, advertising and speeches, it is planned to impress every housewife with the fact that her failure to prepare tin cans for salvage endangers the swift prosecution of the war against the Japs.

Michigan's plan of tin can collection is rated as one of the best in the nation, with curb collections effective in all cities of more than 10,000 population. A new grocery store plan of collection is being launched in many communities under 10,000 and in rural areas whereby customers may deliver their prepared tin cans to grocery stores for collection. Despite these collection conveniences, however, many communities are turning up curbed salvage receipts at less than half the previous level.

Mexican Navy
The Mexican navy was born during the struggle for independence from Spain which began in 1810, when sea-going patriots employed tiny sailboats to run arms and supplies to their fighting comrades on land. But it first emerged as a fighting force when Gen. Jose Maria Morelos took Port San Diego, in the Pacific seaport of Acapulco, and carried off as prizes the Spanish schooner Guadalupe and 11 armed row boats. Shortly after, the little navy had its baptism of fire in the waters off Coahuacalco. In a brief, but sharp, encounter, the Mexican ship La Patria vanquished the Spanish man-of-war La Numinata and sailed it triumphantly into port.
