

Corn on the Cob
It has been established that cobs make up a much smaller proportion and grain a much larger percentage of the crop when corn is raised on soil fertilized with nitrogen, phosphorus, potassium and calcium contained 15 per cent or 10.5 pounds of cob per bushel of ear-corn; while the same hybrid corn grown on unfertilized land contained 350 pounds more cobs than 100 bushels grown on treated land.

Reporting on the Steel company's plan in San Francisco resulted in a 400 per cent general increase in illumination as measured by a light meter, and in some sections of the plant the painted areas was 10 times brighter, says "Paint Progress." Old Aleuts Practiced Two-Way Polygamy

Inhabitants of the Alaskan region, ancient Aleuts, had a primitive civilization of their own, anthropologists say. The Aleuts practiced two-way polygamy, with a man entitled to as many wives as he could support by hunting, and a woman to as many husbands as she could keep house for. Wives were obtained by violent capture, or by purchase from their parents, followed by molestation to preserve illusions of human methods. When a man married, he was encouraged to keep adding to his harem all the younger sisters and cousins in the region he converted.

Destitute names were used by the Aleuts. Some translate to such phrases as, "The Quickly Speaking Person," "The One Who Is Always Lying," and "The Sea Lion's Hair." Punishment of children was rare. Almost the only type known, and one common to all Eskimos, consists of plucking a crystal infant into snags or bushes. This remedy, performed in winter when broken ice, is very effective."

Shirt Storage

If shirts are to be put away folded, hang them on coat hangers until completely dry. Then fold each shirt according to following steps: 1. Place shirt, front side up, on table and pull up middle and bottom sections. 2. Place front down and fold each side of shirt over, lengthwise, for about one-fourth of the width. 3. Fold one sleeve along back lengthwise, then fold other sleeve on top of it. 4. Fold up the tail of the shirt about 7 to 9 inches. 5. Fold again, bringing the tail fold up to the collar. 6. To shoulder eye at both upper corners. 8. If desired, shirt may be folded over a piece of cardboard cut to fit.
