

Corn on the Cob
It has been estimated that cobs make up a much smaller proportion and grain a much larger percentage of the crop when corn is grown on properly fertilized land. At the Illinois college of agriculture, corn grown on soil fertilized with nitrogen, phosphorus, potassium and calcium contained 15 per cent or 10.5 pounds of cobs per 70-pound bushel of ear-corn; while the same hybrid from unfertilized land on this field contained 20 per cent or 14 pounds of cobs per bushel of ear-corn. This means that each 100 bushels of ear-corn grown on this unfertilized land contained 250 pounds more cobs than 100 bushels grown on treated land.




Shirts Storage
If shirts are to be put away folded, hang them on coat hangers until completely dry. Then fold each shirt according to following steps: 1. Place shirt, front side up, on table buttons. 2. Place front down and fold each side of shirt over, lengthwise, for about one-fourth of the width. 3. Fold one sleeve along back lengthwise, then fold other sleeve on top of it. 4. Fold up the tail of the shirt about 7 to 9 inches. 5. Then fold again, bringing the bottom fold up to the collar. Pin to shoulder yoke at both upper corners. 6. If desired, shirt may be folded over a piece of cardboard cut to fit.

plenty in his short career, but he had never stopped to understand what was really behind the people and the stories he made into headlines. In Poland he inherited a strangely attractive secretary, Yashna. She excited him because she knew things he was just beginning to perceive. From the bombing of Warsaw he went to Paris, puzzled and disturbed by the spread of the Nazi terror. He found himself feeling the impact of the tragedies he cabled home—something a veteran newspaperman should never do.

He got to London and in the blitz met a little English waitress whose sister had just been killed in an air-raids. She didn't seem interested in sympathy — or David. But in trying to restore her faith in living, he himself glimpsed a world he had never thought existed.

Extending Meat
One way of extending meat is to use the meats with vegetables—serve meat stew or pie. Potatoes, carrots, parsnips, turnips, green beans—almost any vegetable you can name goes well in meat pies and stews. The party pot on pies not only stretches the flavor; it adds a full body to the stew and is crisp and tasty.
