Golf classes for beginners, intermediates and advanced groups will meet Tuesdays beginning April 18 or Thursdays beginning April 20 from 7-10 p.m. There will be three indoor and five outdoor sessions for \$15.

The gym facilities and swimming pool will be made available for men's recreation on Mondays from 7:30-9:30 p.m. The fee is \$9 per person. Hearing Is Held On Howard Rd.

FARMINGTON A decision is expected by Oakland County in early March whether Howard Road in Farmington Township will be designated a natural beauty road.

A public hearing was held Monday, Feb. 28, in the office of Farmington Township Supervisor Earl Teeple. It was the first hearing of its kind in the county because the legislation providing for natural beauty roads was just enacted last spring.

The hearing was conducted by the Oakland County Road Commission and attended by 14 residents who discussed making Howard a natural beauty road between Drake and Halstead in Farmington Township. Heading up the hearing was Fraxer Staman of the road commission.

The township board will make a final recommendation on possible designation, and the decision will then be made by the Oakland County Board of Commissioners. All 14 appeared to be in favor of the designation since none spoke out against it.

Some of the speakers pointed out that this roadway is one of the few remaining in Oakland County that has not felt the blade of the bulldozer or developer.

DEFOLIANTS have been used, adds Teeple, but the county has promised to refrain from this in the future on this stretch of Howard.

"Scout leaders and naturalists come to this area for a personal touch with nature at all times of the year," adds Teeple. "It has been described as a truly beautiful Christmas card picture area."

"Natural fauna remains, a natural curve in the roadway and a natural valley, creating an exceptional view for those who visit it today and a remarkable site for the two mills that once were there."

Teeple points out that the 100th anniversary of Farmington will be observed and urges that Howard be preserved as part of the community's heritage.

Petitions Available

FARMINGTON Nominating petitions for precinct delegate candidates are now available in the Farmington city clerk's office at Liberty and Grand River.

In previous years, petitions had to be picked up from the Oakland County clerk in Pontiac but have been made available in Farmington City Hall for the May 16 presidential preference primary.

Precinct delegate candidates must file nominating petitions by 4 p.m. March 24.
