

Church Congregation Sets First Mass

A new Catholic congregation, composed of families in Canton Center, Plymouth, Westland and Livonia, will gather for its first mass at 10:30 a.m. Sunday, March 5, in the Fiegel elementary school, 39750 Joy, Plymouth.

The congregation, without building or yet parish name, is being established because the Catholics in the area have asked for a close-to-home place to worship.

The Rev. Gerald K. Flannery, appointed pastor for the approximately 240 families, will celebrate the first mass and others to be held regularly on Sundays. He is taking on the new responsibility in addition to serving as director of the deacon internship program in the Archdiocese of Detroit.

"THE CHURCH isn't a building or a piece of property — it's the people," said Mrs. Thomas Stevenson of Canton Township, who, with her husband, spearheaded the drive to establish the new congregation.

"We're thrilled to be beginning services," she added. "We'll have 10-20 mass each Sunday and play it by ear as to whether others are added and what the times will be."

She said residents of the area have been working to arrange space, seating, music and refreshments for a fellowship time to follow mass.

Fish is an organization of approximately 150 members from 25 churches in Livonia, united in an effort to provide emergency help to their neighbors.
