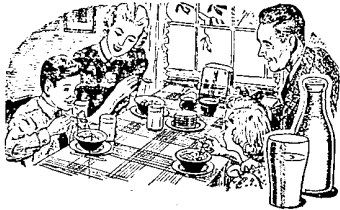

Commodore Hornblower — C. S. Forester. Horatio Hornblower is as real to most readers as Nelson or Nimitz. In this, the fourth sea-arc tale about this redoubtable seaman, he returns to sea with the rank of Commodore in command of a small but powerful squadron on a mission of such delicacy that the fate of Europe hangs on the outcome. Napoleon stands against both Russia and Sweden and it is Hornblower's task to see that these countries maintain their shaky friendship with Britain. The appearance in the Baltic of Hornblower's squadron brings a new twist to the story. The sea-arc tale about this redoubtable seaman, he returns to sea with the rank of Commodore in command of a small but powerful squadron on a mission of such delicacy that the fate of Europe hangs on the outcome. Mellowed slightly by his life on land, and his love for Lady Barbara, his wife, Hornblower has lost none of the audacity and quick thinking that made his earlier reputation for daring. Rather, he has blended these skills with a subtle diplomatic technique which not only inspires his captains, but also impresses the weight of the whole British Navy on the minds of the rulers of Europe. Commodore Hornblower may be a mild, simple man in his own eyes, but on the quarterdeck of a flagship he is Great Britain personified — socially, politically and militarily.

To the reader he is an authentic human being, humanly torn by doubts of himself, humanly bolstering his courage with desperation and covering his sensitiveness with discipline, all too humanly involved in personal relationships and personal worries which have nothing to do with the Lords of the Admiralty.

The Peoples of Malaysia — Fay-Cooper Cole. The vast area

known as Malaysia includes the Philippines, Bali, and Java, Borneo, British Malaysia and many of the South Pacific Islands. This is the story of the people of these distant places — people whom the American soldier is coming to know as loyal and heroic fighters. Written by an authority whose knowledge was gained through years of living in tropic islands and the swamps and jungles of the area, it describes vividly the lives and customs of the many tribes, their weird taboos and strange social practices; their hopes, fears, loves and hates. It introduces the reader to the courts of the Malayan sultans, and gives an intimate picture of the civilized Filipinos.

With enough of history to explain the conditions that existed when war came, it is a full, rich and dependable survey of the human beings of the exotic East, written for Americans who want to know better a part of the world which must play an increasing role in the post-war era.

Ancestors' Brocades — Millicent Todd Bingham. As it describes the circumstances attending the first appearance of Emily Dickinson's poetry, this is a book of importance to American literary history. More than that, it is a story of human beings driven by love and hatred in a drama stranger than fiction.

In 1851, David Peck Todd, a young astronomer, and his wife, Mabel Loomis Todd, arrived in Amherst to make their home near the two Dickinson households. In one house lived Emily, a gentle recluse, who was known to write verses, and her bleak, arrogant sister, Lavinia, in the other their brother, Austin, his wife and children.

When Emily died five years later Lavinia found dozens of little fascicles of neatly inscribed poems and in addition hundreds of odd scraps of paper on which were written poems and fragments of poems, many of them unrepublishable. Because of her devotion to her sister and without any real knowledge of their worth,

Lavinia was determined that these poems should be published. She turned to her neighbor, Mabel Loomis Todd for help, and Mrs. Todd began the long labor of editing the poetry in consultation with her husband and Colonel Higginson, a literary oracle of the day. Three small volumes of poems and two volumes of letters appeared, creating a furor on both sides of the Atlantic. Emily Dickinson, for all that the used words and rhythms in a startling and unorthodox fashion, was acclaimed a new genius.

Meanwhile, in quiet Amherst a feud was simmering which, during his lifetime, Austin Dickinson prevented from breaking into open hostility. But with his death the evil of politeness was stripped away and affairs reached a climax that is the denouement of this book.

This, in broad outline, is the story told in "Ancestors' Brocades," by Millicent Todd Bingham, the daughter of Mrs. Todd.
