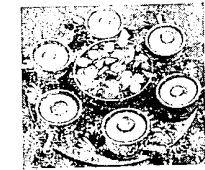

Cozy Eggs
 4 cups boiling water
 1½ tablespoons salt
 1 cup cream
 1½ cups enriched farina
 6 tablespoons vitaminized margarine
 1½ teaspoons pepper
 1½ cups enriched farina
 Add salt and farina to water and cook until thickened. Add margarine and pepper. Pour into 6 individual casseroles. Make a depression in the center of each and drop in an egg. Sprinkle with salt if desired. Bake in moderate oven (350° F.) 15 minutes. Yield: 6 servings.

Fast Drying
 Furniture manufacturers are reported to be saving three to four days in delivery of furniture by infra-red drying. Formerly an overnight air dry was required between coats of finish. Now the drying time has been cut to as little as 20 minutes. Vastly extended use of the infra-red drying method in many lines of manufacture is foreseen for the postwar era. In addition to speeding up production, the method saves valuable floor space.

Sign of Age
 One of the marks of time appearing in some eyes are the little white spots seen at the edge of the cornea, says the Better Vision Institute. Appearing generally in middle life, sometimes these spots are mistaken for cataract; actually they are harmless and have no effect upon vision. They are, however, a sign of age.

Vaccines from Eggs
 Half a million American hens are now laying eggs to be "half vaccinated" for conversion into vaccines to fight typhus and influenza. Owners of these specially selected birds get 15 cents a dozen more than for ordinary eggs because of numerous exacting requirements. For instance, only white eggs are used, thus making detection of contaminating dirt on the shells easier. Also, to promote essential cleanliness and reduce nest breakage, eggs are collected often for shipment in trucks heated to maintain incubation temperature. At the laboratory, the eggs are "seeded" with the virus incubation through an aperture in the air-cell end of the egg. The break in the shell is sealed, and the egg returned to the incubator. The virus multiplies and the desired antigen, as well as the infectious material, is produced in the embryo. The infectious qualities are destroyed by chemical treatment before the vaccine is released.

Broomcorn Imports
 Despite domestic production, broomcorn at the turn of the 20th century was regularly to be found among America's imports, most of it coming from Italy and Austria. Hungary. To this fact is attributed a major catastrophe to American agriculture—the introduction of the European corn-borer. The corn-borer, getting its first foothold in the northeastern United States, is believed to have reached America's shores in 1908 or 1909 in baled European broomcorn. The European damage it had caused to the corn crop within a few short years caused a revolution in quarantine and fumigation requirements for imported plant material.

Fine Hot Rolls Add Zest to Simple Meal

Fine light hot rolls can lift the simplest everyday meal to a "Sun-day" level. Of course they must be good hot rolls, and food specialists suggest some rules to follow, whether you use the straight dough method or the sponge method.

If you vary your flour type, using whole wheat, Graham, rye or soya flour, it is important to check amounts used. Dough made of these flours should be softer than for white bread; therefore the proportionate amount of flour is less.

In determining desired results, you may wish to sacrifice some of the lightness obtained by using water, to nutritious quality gained by using milk, or you may go all out for a tender, fluffy product by using potato water and mashed potatoes.

Eggs make the dough richer, and give a slightly crisp crust that is somewhat flaky and tender. Sugar and salt are flavor ingredients, and fat improves both flavor and texture. Be sure to use all these ingredients in proper amounts for the best results. Salt retards the rising process, too much sugar promotes toughening and helps the dough to rise more quickly. Correct temperature is important during the mixing and rising process and should never be higher than 90 degrees F. at the moment it is added; if not, then remember that 80 degrees will feel cool, not warm, to the skin.

Indian Is Good Fighter, But Likes Chief Best

Than the American Indian there is no fiercer fighter in our army. He is a thorough soldier and his definition embraces obedience to orders. But deep within him pulses a primary tribal custom adherence which even the army can obliterate. Indian soldiers respect their superiors in rank, but more deeply ingrained is a feeling greater respect is due his own chief.

When the famed 41st infantry division first moved out into the Pacific to grapple with the Jap it contained a complete company composed of Sioux, all from the same town of Poplar, Mont. Matters never seemed to run smoothly; there were slight frictions and an apparent discontent. Even the vauntedly stout Redman was frequently caught moping and complaining. But to the regimental staff the cause was baffling.

At length a quiet investigation revealed that the captain of the company was out-ranked according to Sioux social standards by a sergeant and, more, a rear-guard private was the top chief of them all. Rather than attempt to persuade the Indians they were living under a standard of undivided respect of the unit's personnel was effected. They were scattered throughout the division.

Tankless Heaters
 Many improvements have been made in recent years in the operation of water heaters of the tankless type used in connection with the hot water or steam boiler which heats the house. Among the advantages of tankless heaters are said to be the saving of space, fuel economy in that there is no heat loss from a tank, and elimination of the maintenance expense of a hot water tank. The householder's sun parlor could be built at 3rd level the year around, summer as well as winter. The water is heated in non-evaporating copper coils submerged in water heated from a gas system boiler, circulating through an enduring cast iron body. Tankless water heaters are made in a wide range of sizes. Thousands are already in use today and many new homes to be built after victory will use this economical method of heating domestic water the year around.

Speed Plant Breeding

In the plant world, the geneticists, pathologists and other specialists have developed many shortcuts in the operations necessary in bringing about crop improvements. The agricultural research administration of the Department of Agriculture cites examples of these methods which it says not only save time in experimental work but also save space needed for growing lots of plants. As one example, varieties and strains of tomato plants can be tested for fusarium wilt resistance in a hotbed in which the soil is highly infected with this destructive disease and kept at temperature and moisture points highly favorable to it. The seedlings soon succumb or, on the other hand, show resistance. One way to cut them in to hand multiply (bag containing about four ounces of paradichlorobenzene, purchased from the drug store, inside the plastic bag) all cracks and the plants are sealed for a week until the fumes have reached and killed all moth life. 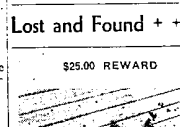
