Roll call: Nacker, Bagnall, Hinger, Hatton and Conroy. Carried, all years. Motion made by Hatton and supported by Hinger that Commissioner Alfred G. Jones' letter be placed on file, and that he be granted a leave of absence. Carried, all years. Motion made by Bagnall and supported by Nacker, that the letter received from Mr. Richard Welch of 26220 Taft Road, Northville, Michigan, containing his offer to collect and dispose of garbage once a week at the residence of the City of Farmington for the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1500.00) a year payable monthly, contract to run one year or more be referred to Commissioner Conroy for consideration with authority to proceed if the plan proves advisable. Carried, all years. Motion made by Bagnall and supported by Conroy that the budget classification on public works, the present budget allowance of \$1230.00 for street repairs be increased to \$2500.00, that under the same account under sidewalk repairs be increased from \$1000.00 to \$2500.00, and that under the item of capital expenditures, the item for trucks be increased from \$1500.00 to \$2500.00 to be taken out of the General Fund Reserve. Carried, all years. Motion made by Hinger and supported by Conroy that Commissioner Hatton be authorized to purchase a new truck for the City, not to exceed the amount allowed in the budget. Roll call: Nacker, Bagnall, Hinger, Hatton and Conroy. Carried, all years. Motion made by Bagnall and supported by Conroy to adjourn. Carried, all years.
