**Soft Shades**

For pale lavender add about three parts of ultramarine blue and one part madder lake to white. For grayed lavender add ultramarine blue and madder lake to white, graying it off by adding a little chrome yellow. For lilac add a small amount of ultramarine blue and rose madder to white. For orchid, wisteria and lavender are basically violet-red. They can be mixed satisfactorily from white and rose pink.

**Seal Roll**
