Sergeant Frederick J. Taylor was recently decorated with the Air Medal. The award was made in recognition of courageous service in his combat organization, his fellow American airmen, his country and his home. He was cited for meritorious achievement while participating in aerial flights in the Pacific Area from April 15, 1945 to June 19, 1945, taking part in sustained operational flight missions during which hostile contact was probable and expected. These operations, consisting of bombing missions against enemy airbases and installations as well as attacks on naval and cargo vessels, aided considerably in victory in this theatre.

His wife, who lives at 21735 Tulane Avenue, Farmington, was notified of the decoration by General George C. Kenney, Commanding General of the Far East Air Forces.

Speeded home from overseas as part of the "Green Project" which calls for the Air Transport Command's Caribbean Division to fly 30,000 returnees from Europe to Miami Army Air Field each month, another Farmington man is back in the States. He is T. J. William Carson of Route 3, Farmington. creative air attacks but pumped its own main-battery shells into Jap targets. The Walker operated within two miles of Japan unopposed. Her battle record includes the operations at Tarawa, Guam, Hollandia, Saipan, Tinian, Guam, Leyte, Okinawa and Kyushu.

James E. Bone, electrician's mate, third class, USNR, whose wife, Mrs. Jean L. Bone, and two children live at 22615 Tulane St., Farmington, serves aboard the USS Bon Homme Richard, one of 20 aircraft carriers in an armada of 133 combat ships that aided in forcing the surrender of Japan. The Bon Homme Richard sent waves of planes from her flight deck to bombard Jap cities, factories and airfields in the final days of the war.

The morning of the first attack on the Tokyo area, the men sat down at 2 a.m. for breakfast. The radio blared out with an electrical transcription of "I'm Dreaming of a White Christmas." Eyes drifted off with each individual dream or memory of a happy Christmas. "Let's go in and get this damned business over with," somebody snapped. The men emptied their trays and went off to their battle stations.

ship to be named for the city of Helena, Montana, the first taken out of commission in 1932, and the second, after aiding in the destruction of a vastly superior Japanese force, was sunk in the Kula Gulf action of July, 1943. One of the three sons of Mrs. A. J. Carmack of Booneville, Kentucky, serving in the armed forces, the sailor entered the service in August, 1941. He was stationed at Camp Peary, Virginia, before reporting to Newport. He is married to the former Doris Schlegel, and they have two children, Marilynn, age 6, and Scherry, 2. Carmack is a former graduate of Booneville High School and worked for the Ex-Cell-O Corporation, Detroit. His two brothers are with the Army overseas.
