

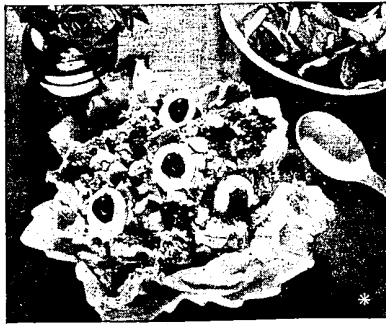

ed as a common seaman, without his father's knowledge, and bent on a mission of his own.

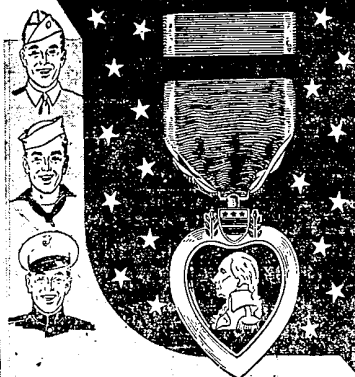
Little did young Peter suspect when he sailed on the whaler the Ella Gordon under the cruel Captain Beethle that the ship was no longer a part of his father's fleet.

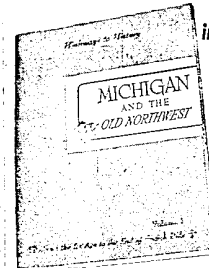
