## Mardiros Hits Auto Insurers

Ron Mardiros, candidate for the Democratic nomination for Congress in the 13th District, last week called for repeal of the new 10 per cent surtax on incomes and asked Congress to end "the abuses of auto insurance companies."

Mardiros, 31122 Plymouth Rd., Livonia, listed insurance abuses as "increasing rates without justification; canceling policies without cause; refusing to write policies in low-income areas; obtaining licenses when financially unsound; and writing insurance for some groups but not for others."

Speaking Sunday to Fisher Body Local No. 598 of the United Auto Workers, Mardiros said, "We cannot continue a situation in which every attempt on the part of people seeking better housing, better education, better economic conditions—in short, a better way of life—is choked off, as it has been for the past four years by inflation, high interest rates, a tight money market and now higher income taxes."

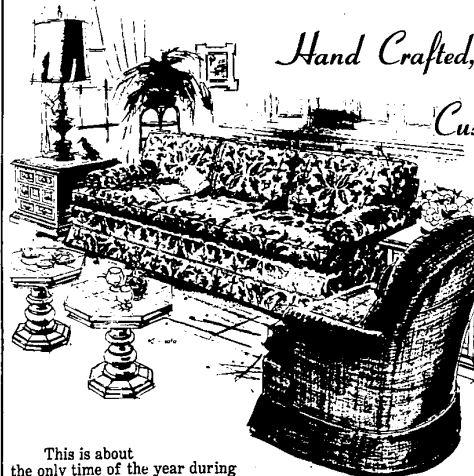
