Brides Make Top Buyers

Prefer Spray Over Flu Shots

Dead flu viruses sprayed directly into the respiratory tract are superior to standard shots in protecting a person against influenza, a University of Florida doctor reports.

Results of tests on more than 2,000 prisoners showed the spray gives greater protection during a flu epidemic, shorter time of illness for those that of the control of the spray gives greater protection of the shorter time of illness for those that of the control of the shorter time of illness for those that one of greater ease of administration than the shots. Dr. Robert III, Waldman, post-doctoral fellow in the department of microbiology at the university, gathered his data during the Asian flu epidemic that hit the Florida Slaze Prison at Radford in January.

The spray was 70 per cent effective against the epidemic that struck the prison, whereas flu shots were only 23 per cent effective.


