Mr. Hall is nationally known in the field of Health and Safety Education. He was formerly a high school director of Christian education and has also taught personal hygiene and allied topics. He has taught swimming, life saving, camping and seamanship to thousands of Scouts and other young men.

On Monday evening, October 22, Mr. Hall meets with the American Red Cross - Boy Scout Life Saving Corps, members of which supervise Scouting's Swimming and Life Saving Program. This meeting is scheduled at the Durfee Intermediate School where actual demonstrations will be conducted in the pool. Also included in his itinerary are appearances at District 5 Training Course, Harper Hospital, Tuesday evening, October 23; District 4 Training Course, Highland Park Junior High School, Wednesday, October 24; and a Council-wide Merit Badge Counsellors' Rally in Central High School Friday evening, October 26.

On Saturday and Sunday, October 27-28, a weekend Health and Safety conference is scheduled at Mackenzie High School gym and field. Outdoor demonstrations will be given in axeman'ship, night hiking safety, physical fitness training, fire building and cooking. This conference is open to all interested adult leaders including Scoutmasters, Camping Committee Members, Training Course Faculties, Senior Scout Leaders, Commissioners and District Health and Safety Committee Members.

Question—What is the longest chapter in the Bible?  
Answer—The 119th Psalm with 175 verses.

Q.—Are there any parallels in the Old Testament?  
A.—Yes, many. For instance, the parable of the trees making a king, Judges 9:1-5.

Q.—What is meant by a creed?  
A.—It is from the Latin word "credo" — "I believe" — and is a statement of belief or doctrine.

Q.—About how much time elapsed between the last of the Old Testament to the first of the New Testament?  
A.—A hundred years.

Q.—Was Matthew one of the twelve apostles?  
A.—He was? (See Mark 2:14.) Before his conversion he was a publican, or tax collector. (Matthew 10:3.)

Q.—How long was Noah's ark?  
A.—If the length of the ancient cubit is accepted as 21 inches, the ark was about 325 feet long. (Genesis 6:15.)

Q.—Where is the text that says, "cleanliness is next to godliness"?  
A.—There is no such text in the Bible. Isaiah 1:16 says: "Wash you, make you clean; put away the evil of your doings from before Mine eyes; cease to do evil."

Q.—What became of the gold from Solomon's temple?  
A.—When the Romans took Jerusalem, they carried much treasure to Rome. When Rome was captured by Alaric about A. D. 400 much gold was taken from the city and later buried in his tomb—some say in a riverbed in Italy. Some of the treasure of Rome, including the golden candlestick from the temple at Jerusalem, was carried off to Africa by the Vandals, and has not been found since.

Q.—The word "ark" seems to refer to more than one thing in the Bible—what are they?  
A.—(1). Noah's ark — a ship, Genesis 6:14-16; 8:1-13. (2). Moser's ark—a little boatlike cradle in which his mother hid the baby Moses in the flags on the bank of the Nile. Exodus 2:3-5. (3). God's ark—the ark of the covenant, or testimony—a gold covered box in which the stone tablets of the Ten Commandments were placed. Exodus 25:10-22; 37:1-9; Hebrews 9:4; I Kings 8:9; II Chronicles 6:2; I Samuel 6:3.

**PROFESSOR OF HISTORY ON LECTURE SERIES**

"America's Future in Asia" will be the title of a lecture to be given by Hans Kohn, internationally known authority on modern history at Detroit Town Hall in the Fisher Theatre, Wednesday morning, October 24th at eleven o'clock.

Professor Kohn, a brilliant and dynamic speaker, has held the chair of history at Smith College since 1934, and is the author of many books, and articles in encyclopedias. He has traveled widely, and lived for many years in Russia, Great Britain, and the Near East. At Smith College, his

lectures on the vital problems of the day draw "standing room only" audiences.

A native of Prague, Czechoslovakia, the noted historian has spoken at many American Universities since his arrival in the United States under the auspices of the Institute of International Education in New York City. He was visiting professor at Harvard University; Radcliffe and Mt. Holyoke Colleges, and the University of Colorado. Among the fourteen books written by the authority are "Western Civilization in the Near East," "Force of Reason," and "Not By Arms Alone," now in its third printing. 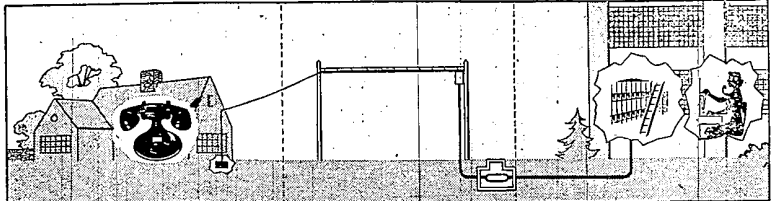
