Feed Alters Chickens
Type and color of feathers in New Hampshire Red chickens have been influenced by the kind of grain fed. Untreated oat hulls and wheat bran produced dark, uniform, glossy and complete feathering. Cooking oat hulls under pressure destroyed their ability to produce normal color, and feathers were light and not uniform. Ground wheat alone produced feathers which were soft and silky, but ground wheat and wheat shorts fed together produced the most chicks with abnormal plumage.
