Effective Date Set For February 1

The Farmington City Commission held a special meeting, and a regular meeting during the past week.

The special meeting was held for the purpose of passing a resolution requesting permission from the Michigan State Highway Department to place a community Christmas tree at 3332 Grand River Avenue, in the City of Farmington, said tree to be removed no later than January 31.

The standard for the tree was put in place on Thursday morning, under the direction of the Farmington Kiwanis Club.

At the regular meeting of the Commission on Wednesday evening, proposed amendments to Sections 263, 265 and 220 of the Zoning Ordinance were given their third and final reading.

Also, an Ordinance to be known as Ordinance C-23-45 of the City of Farmington was given first and second reading, the third and final reading to be given on January 9, 1946, and the Ordinance to become effective February 1, 1946.

This Ordinance provides for the regulations and annual physical examination of all persons handling open and exposed foods and drinks, or utensils for preparing and serving same, under the conditions of the Ordinance every employee of a restaurant, soft drink parlor, ice cream bar, market, grocery store, or any place at all that has to do with the dispensing, preparing or serving of food or drink, must have a physical examination by some duly licensed physician in the City of Farmington.

Upon receipt of a signed statement from the physician that he has examined the person in question, and found him or her to be free from any infectious, contagious or venereal disease, the City Clerk will issue a "Food Handlers' Permit Card."

Each person must have such an examination each year, and a new permit card will be issued annually.
