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The 1945 apple crop in New England was the shortest since 1910. It is even smaller than the 1921 crop which old timers thought was a terrible disaster.

Quick Freezing
The desirability of speed cannot be emphasized in quick-freezing fruits and vegetables. Never prepare them the night before and hold to take to the freezer locker the following day. They should be processed as soon as possible after harvesting. If delay is necessary, the products should be packed in crushed ice or kept in a room of from 32 to 40 degrees Fahrenheit for not more than a few hours.
