COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS

Regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Farmington was held on December 12th, 1945.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Hamlin at 8:30 p.m.

Commissioners Present: Nacker, Hinger, Halton and Conroy.

Minutes of the regular meeting held November 13th, 1945 were read and approved.

Motion made by Hinger and supported by Conroy that the bills presented to the Commission for the month of November, 1945 be paid. Roll Call: Nacker, Hinger, Halton and Conroy. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Hinger and supported by Conroy that the City Commission approve payment to the Detroit Concrete Products Corporation of Item No. 1 in the amount of \$7,375.51. Roll Call: Hinger, Conroy, Halton and Nacker. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Hinger and supported by Conroy that the proposed amendments to Sections 263, 265 and 266 of the Zoning Ordinance presented to the Commission by the Board of Appeals and duly read to the reading of November 13th, 1945 and legally advertised in accordance with the Zoning Ordinance, we have the third and final reading. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Halton and supported by Nacker that we proceed with the third and final reading in regard to the amendments to Sections 263, 265 and 266 of the Zoning Ordinance which has been legally advertised in accordance with the Zoning Ordinance and that said amendments to Sections 263, 265 and 266 read as follows:

Section 263: In a Commercial A District a motor supply station may be permitted by the Board of Appeals under the conditions specified herein only after a public hearing as specified in Sections 46a and 46b.

Section 265: In a Commercial B District a service garage or a motor supply station may be permitted by the Board of Appeals.

Section 266: Front yards are not required by this Ordinance, but, nothing herein shall be construed as prohibiting them; Provided, that single dwellings hereafter erected on any lot within a Commercial A District or a Commercial B District, shall observe and conform to the regulations for front yards required in a Residence A District or a Residence B District in accordance with the total lot area specified elsewhere in this Ordinance, the single family dwellings in Residence A District and/or Residence B Districts respectively; Provided Further, that there is a front yard of ten (10) feet or less, or where any part of the front building line is ten (10) feet or less from the front line the entire front building line shall be parallel to the street line. Carried, all yeas.

Motion made by Conroy and supported by Hinger that the following Ordinance No. C-23-45 to provide for the regulation and annual physical examination of all persons handling open and exposed foods and drinks in the City of Farmington, Michigan be placed on its first and second reading, final reading to be made on January 9, 1946 at the regular meeting of the City Commission.

Section 1: All persons handling open and exposed foods and drinks and utensils used to prepare or serve same in the City of Farmington, shall pass a physical examination as required by the Health Officer of the City of Farmington and have a "Food Handler's Permit Card" in his or her possession before starting to work, and submit to an annual physical examination thereafter.

Section 2: The City Clerk shall have available "Food Handler's Examination Blanks" to be used by such persons. These Blanks (Form No. A) must be filled out and signed by a physician duly licensed to practice in the State of Michigan and shall be filed with the City Clerk who will issue the "Food Handler's Permit Card" to the individual.

Section 3: No person who is affected with any infectious or contagious or venereal diseases in a communicable form shall work, or be permitted to work, in any "Food Establishment" in the City of Farmington, Michigan.

Section 4: Within thirty days after the passing of the Ordinance, or on March 1 of each year hereafter, all operators and employees in a "Food Establishment", which shall include restaurants, lunch stands, grocery stores, meat markets, bakeries, cafes, dining rooms, ice cream parlors, public or private markets, stalls, shops, stores, warehouses, cold storage plants, or any other place where opened and exposed foods and drinks are handled and sold for human consumption, shall file with the City Clerk of the City of Farmington, Michigan, a "Food Handler's Physical Examination Blank" and obtain a "Food Handler's Permit Card" as provided in Sections 1 and 2, and be approved by the Health Officer of the City of Farmington, Michigan.

Section 5: The employer, manager, or supervisor of each employee and the employee concerned, will be held responsible if he or she has knowledge that they have any infectious, contagious, or venereal disease in communicable form, or has a fever, skin eruption, cough lasting more than three weeks or any other suspicious symptoms which might be detrimental to the health or safety, if they do not require the individual to cease work until a physician licensed to practice in the State of Michigan has given assurance that the individual is qualified to work under the requirements of this Ordinance.

Section 6: The Health Officer of the City of Farmington, Michigan, is hereby given authority to take whatever action is necessary for the protection of public health and safety.

Section 7: Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall be fined not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) and the cost of prosecution, or by imprisonment not to exceed ninety days, or both. Such fine or imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.

Section 8: This Ordinance shall take full force and effect on the first day of February, 1946 and shall be published with the Council proceedings in the Farmington Enterprise, Farmington, Michigan, December, 1945 and January, 1946, this being considered due notice to all concerned.

Carried all yeas.

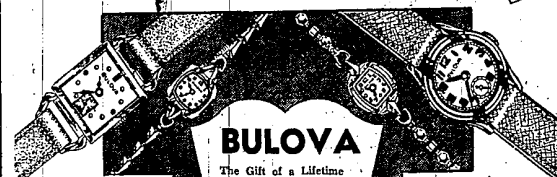

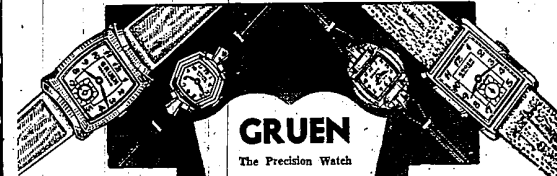

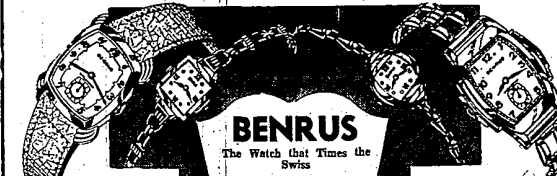
