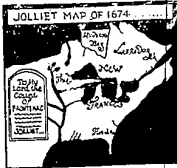


"MICHIGAN AND THE OLD NORTHWEST"

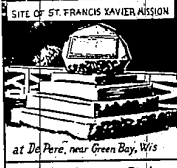


On June 17, Marquette and Joliet entered the river at Prairie du Chien.

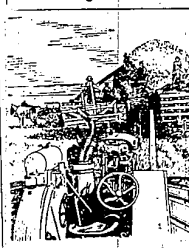

Milk Film Removes Cold Rinse From Utensils
An advance rinse in clear, cold water will save time and trouble in washing dishes and glasses. Calcium and protein, — two of the important food values in milk — cause difficulties in dish washing. Most housewives know how hard it is to wash glasses, pitchers and other milk containers clean. The reason is that calcium forms an insoluble curd with the soap in the dish water which clogs the pores of the glass.

Milk on clothed dish cloths, table cloths and towels may leave a stubborn stain after washing. A cloth used to take up spilled milk may come out of the wash tub unwhitely stiff. The effect of the soap on calcium and heat on protein show up.

If milky dishes and fabrics are rinsed with clear cold water before coming in contact with warm soapy water, much of the calcium and protein will be carried away so that the washing may be done satisfactorily.

Poisonous Mushroom
There is certain death in the scaly, red-topped Amanita mushroom which meets the mushroom picker's eye. This mushroom contains a powerful poison that stops the action of the heart muscles, and a single bite may prove fatal. The Amanita may be recognized not only by its scaly red top, which makes it conspicuous, but also by a fagged, paper-like collar which hangs around the stalk just below the cap, and by the large bulbous base. The action gives the top the appearance of having been sprinkled with a sticky breakfast food. The first symptoms of poisoning are cramps and pain in the stomach, and the victim usually comes within a half hour to two hours unless the poison is pumped from the stomach immediately. One one-hundredth grain of atropine is considered to be an antidote.

Sweeten Sour Cream
You can make a sweetened sour cream dressing by adding sugar, vinegar and lemon juice to the whipped sour cream and seasoning with salt and pepper. Ingredients for a half cup of sour cream call for one tablespoon of sugar, one tablespoon of lemon juice, two tablespoons of vinegar, one-fourth teaspoon of salt and a little pepper. Mix the sugar, lemon juice, vinegar and salt and pepper together and add them to the sour cream after it is whipped. When you whip your sour cream take care that you don't overbeat it or else you'll churn the cream to butter. It helps to keep the cream cold while you whip it. You can do this by setting the bowl of sour cream in a bowl of crushed ice.
