

HOUSE PASSES PETRILLO BILL

By a margin of 222 to 43, the U.S. House of Representatives has supported Congressman George A. Dondero, 17th Michigan District, in his long fight to outlaw interference with the radio broadcast of such cultural programs as the Interlochen music festival. The Dondero proposal was incorporated in the Lea bill and the Senate already has acted favorably upon similar legislation sponsored by Senator Arthur H. Vandenberg of Michigan.

The Lea bill makes it unlawful to lease a licensed operator of a radio station to employ or pay more persons than are needed, to pay for services not rendered, or to refrain from broadcasting non-commercial programs or programs originating outside of the United States. In support of the bill, Rep. Dondero cited the cases at Interlochen and at Royal Oak, where Petrillo once barred a Navy band from participating in a servicemen's honor roll program.

ADMITS GI DEMONSTRATION

Recently Congressman George A. Dondero cited David Livingston as being involved in GI demonstrations overseas. A New York news dispatch, published yesterday, reports that Sgt. David Livingston, pro-Communist vice president of Local 65, Retail and Wholesale Workers, CIO, has admitted that he led the so-called "GI demonstrations" in Hawaii a few weeks ago in an attempt to "change America's foreign policy."

As leader of the demonstrators, Livingston sought to swing the army enlisted men behind the current Communist policy of withdrawing all American troops from China and Japan.

COMMUNIST RADIO ACTIVITIES

The recent disclosure of subversive activities by Communist sympathizers in Canada has served to focus attention on the Russian radio station secretly maintained by the Soviet Government in the Pentagon. Writing in the Washington Evening Star, February 20th, Constantine Brown, in his column, "This Changing World," points to the efforts of U.S. officials to keep its existence secret, and credits Congressman George A. Dondero with disclosing its existence through an exchange of correspondence with John J. McLoe, then the Assistant Secretary of War. What was actually transmitted over the Russian station, nobody knows. Every effort was made to keep the people of the United States in the dark about its existence and it is significant that no similar privileges were granted to any other Allied power, including Great Britain.

BANK FURNISHES G. I. LOAN INFORMATION

The Loan Department of the Farmington State Bank has released some information which will be of interest to all veterans, many of whom have been interested in securing home loans. This information is reprinted for the use of veterans in determining the proper steps to take in securing a guaranteed home loan.

Who is Eligible

Eligibility for a G.I. loan requires that the veteran, man or woman, must have served in some branch of the armed services on or after September 16, 1916, for at least 90 days, unless discharged in less time because of a service-incurred injury or disability, and must have been released under conditions not dishonorable.

Application for a loan must be made within 10 years from date of discharge.

Who Makes G.I. Loans

Guaranteed Home Loans are made by banks and other lending agencies at not over 4 per cent interest. The Veterans Administration does not make loans.

Guaranty

If the Veterans Administration approve the loan, they may guarantee payment up to \$4,000 or 50 per cent of the loan which ever is less.

Conditions Under Which a Home Loan May Be Approved and Guaranteed

The veteran must be able to show sufficient income to meet his usual living expenses and payments on his loan.

The lending agency is required by the Veterans Administration to obtain a written credit report on the veteran from an established credit reporting agency. This report must indicate that the veteran is a desirable borrower, both credit-wise and morally.

The property upon which the veteran wishes to obtain a loan must be examined by an appraiser approved by the Veterans Administration. If the appraised value does not equal the purchase price.

The maximum guaranty available to a veteran is \$4,000. Once this amount has been guaranteed, no further loans for any purpose may be guaranteed.

The veteran must be able to show sufficient income to meet his usual living expenses and payments on his loan.

The lending agency is required by the Veterans Administration to obtain a written credit report on the veteran from an established credit reporting agency. This report must indicate that the veteran is a desirable borrower, both credit-wise and morally.

How Much Will a Home Loan Cost

The following information is supplied by the Farmington State Bank and applies particularly to their operation. However, it is fairly representative of most lending agencies. Let's assume the veteran wishes to obtain a G.I. loan of \$5,000 from the Farmington State Bank. His approximate cost would be as follows:

APPRaisal

The initial appraisal is made by the Farmington State Bank and no charge is made for this. The official appraisal is made by an appraiser approved by the Veterans Administration—cost, \$15.00.

EXAMINATION OF ABSTRACT

is made by an attorney to make certain the title is marketable, and that no error exists in the title. \$10.00.

SURVEY

The property is surveyed by a registered surveyor to certify the boundary lines of the property, \$15.00.

RECORDING

Deed and mortgage must be recorded with the County Clerk, \$3.50.

CREDIT REPORT

This is required by the Veterans Administration, \$15.00.

TITLE SEARCH

This is made to determine that nothing has affected the title between time of examination by attorney and closing.

INSURANCE

All properties must be insured against loss of fire, lightning and windstorm to the extent of the mortgage. On a \$5,000 mortgage the approximate cost would be \$55.00. (If the property is already covered by adequate insurance acceptable to the Bank and can be transferred to the veteran, this item may be omitted.)

TOTAL COST

of a \$5,000 mortgage, \$104.00.

These figures represent actual out of pocket expense paid by the Farmington State Bank to cover the minimum legal requirements. They are charged to the veteran at cost.

A civilian would pay 1 per cent of the amount of the mortgage over and above the figures mentioned above.
