Another twenty-five Oakland County dairy men are participating in the organization of the fifth Cooperative Dairy Herd Improvement Association according to Karl D. Bailey, County Agricultural Agent. He states that more cows are on test for production records in Oakland County than in any county outside the States of New Jersey and California.

The group will be organized at a meeting to be held at 1:30 p.m. Friday, March 15, in the 5th Floor Committee Room of the Court House Annex on Lafayette Street in Pontiac. Meeting is open to any interested farmer. Directors and officers will be elected after the improvement tester will be hired. It is expected the work will get under way by March 25.

Board of Managers Vote Not To Hold State Fair

Last week a joint meeting of the Commission of Agriculture and the Board of Managers of the Michigan State Fair was held at the State Fair grounds in Detroit. Charles Fleg, Director of the Department of Agriculture and the Chairman of the Board of Managers, reported that the grounds had been released by the army and that the Department of Agriculture had again assumed custody of the grounds, which makes the State responsible.

Fleg further reported that the army engineers and the state engineers had agreed on the condition of the grounds at the present time although the amount has not been agreed upon that will be required to restore the property to the condition in which it was at the time the army took over.

It was considered by the Board of Managers very impractical to attempt to hold a State Fair this year, realizing the inability to secure critical material and labor to replace the buildings that have been destroyed by fire and to repair the other buildings, and grounds, and although the Board of Managers was very much interested in having a fair this year, it felt that when one is held it should be the best State Fair "in the country."

Because there will be no State Fair this year, it was decided to again exhibit the State livestock classes at the several county fairs for the past four years. A special committee will be appointed from the Board of Managers to allot these livestock classes to the different county fairs and to select a Livestock Director, who also will serve as secretary to the Board of Managers. Prompt action will be necessary due to the fact that the first county fairs are held in July and that considerable time is necessary to prepare a premium list and to arrange space to accommodate the State Livestock show in addition to the county fair exhibits.

Public interest has not lessened in the Bonine law for the control of disease in livestock. The pathological division of the State Department of Agriculture, is performing an increasing volume of blood sample testing each month that tells an interesting story, says Charles Fleg, Director of the Department.

From last month's records we find that a total of 45,647 specimens were received and examined. Of this total 10,064 specimens were negative to Bang's Disease; 2,931 specimens, or 6.2 per cent, were reacted and 2,613 specimens, or 5.5 per cent were suspects. 155 specimens from swine were examined with only 3 reactors and 2 suspects. Six specimens from goats were examined, all of which were negative.

This summary is revealing in that prior to the Bonine law the percentage of suspects and reactors was 13.0 per cent and 7.8 per cent respectively and since the Bonine law enforcement program, the totals reveal 11.0 per cent suspects and 6.3 per cent reactors.

Improvement in laboratory procedure and a larger staff of experienced personnel are speeding up the reporting of results, says Director Fleg, and with more advanced planning by local veterinarians and stock owners, delays will be largely eliminated.
