Mrs. Guy Durgan of Farmington has been chosen president for the coming year of the Oakland County Girl Scout Committee. Other officers named at the annual meeting held at the Birmingham Community House on Tuesday, February 19, are: Mrs. Wardell Brown, Farmington, 1st vice president; Mrs. John Folkers, Rochester, 2nd vice president; Mrs. Harold Ackerman, Lake Orion, secretary and George Combs, Southfield, treasurer. New committee chairmen are Mrs. George Finch, Bloomfield, committee on camp sites; and Mrs. Lewis Thornton, Troy Township, replacing Mrs. Frank Higby as publicity chairman.

In addition to the annual election of officers, main business of the meeting was discussion of the possibilities for a suitable camp site for the 3000 Girl Scouts in Oakland County, for whom no camp is available. In recent years, the Pontiac camp near Mt. Clemens, Camp Sherwood, has been too crowded to permit taking girls from out-county units, and day camping for these girls has been but a partial substitute. Ayres be given a three year contract starting July 1, 1946, at a salary of \$5,500 per year. There was no second to Schreiber's motion. The vote on the original motion made by Warner carried four to one. Voting for the motion were Bond, Early, Warner and Aschenbrenner, against Schreiber. Schreiber made three motions, all of which failed to come to a vote due to lack of support. He moved that, "A Citizen's Advisory Educational Committee be appointed by this Board consisting of the members of this Board and civic leaders in the District who are active and interested in public education. And that this committee, in an advisory capacity only, assist the Board, the Superintendent and the school architect in planning a comprehensive school building program."

Schreiber's second motion read, "That this Board reconsider the five mill levy for five years for the high school only; and that the proposition be submitted to the people asking that this levy be for the purpose of increasing the Building and Site Fund Account for any school building or site which may be necessary for the greatest good of the schools of the District."

The third motion made by Schreiber stated: "That, relative to the proposed five mill levy for five years for a high school only, this Board call a public hearing for the purpose of advising the Board as to whether or not the sentiment of the District is for first consideration for the use of such funds for additional elementary sites and buildings or for a high school."

VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS

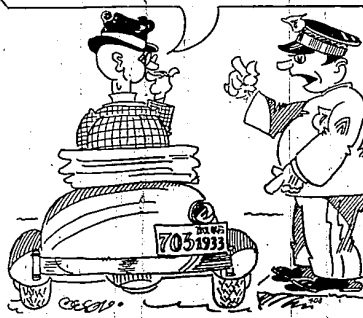
