RESOLUTION

The following Resolution was unanimously adopted at a meeting of the Farmington Township Board March 19, 1946:

"WHEREAS, it is deemed desirable to encourage the use of lands in Farmington Township in accordance with their character and adaptability, and to limit the improper use of land, and

"WHEREAS, it is deemed desirable to conserve the expenditure of funds for public improvements and services to conform with the most advantageous use of land, resources and properties, and

"WHEREAS, it is deemed desirable to conserve property values and the natural resources of the township, to reduce hazards to life and property, and to facilitate adequate provision for a system of transportation, education, recreation and other public requirements, and

"WHEREAS, Act 184 of the Public Acts of 1943 provides that the township boards may enact an ordinance for the establishment of zoning districts in the unincorporated portions of the township, within which districts the use of land for agriculture, residence, forestry, recreation and other purposes may be encouraged, regulated or prohibited, and

"WHEREAS, it is deemed desirable in the interest of the public health, safety, morals and general welfare to provide for the establishment of zoning districts as aforesaid,

"NOW THEREFORE, in order that said Act may become operative in this township in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of said Act, it is resolved that the Township Board of Farmington Township, County of Oakland, State of Michigan, hereby declares its intent to proceed under the provisions of Act 184 of the Public Acts of 1943.

"It is further RESOLVED that this resolution be published as a legal notice in the Farmington Enterprise within ten (10) days of its passage."

Mrs. Hugh White of Birmingham will give a scenic-felt program on Alcohol Education, and special music will be provided for the program.

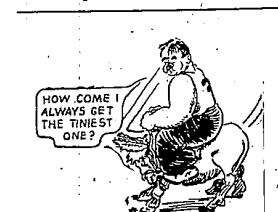
