the position of acting mayor. Detroit C. I. O. unions might like to see Jeffrey elected to get rid of him as mayor of Detroit.
It was Jeffrey, you will recall, who defeated a C. I. O. official, Richard Frankenstein, for reelection as Detroit mayor last year.
Another possible contender is Raymond J. Kelly of Detroit, former sales of the present governor, whose qualifications for the executive office include being a veteran of both World War I and II, a past national commander of the American Legion and a former corporation counsel for the City of Detroit.
Detroit citizens have a weakness for voting for name candidates. Frank Murphy was publicized widely as mayor of Detroit and then governor of Michigan; at a subsequent state election the voters whooped it up for a Democratic namesake, the late Frank Murphy, then an unknown lawyer, to run as lieutenant governor with Murray D. VanWagoner. The main similarity between the two Murphys was their name.
It served as a reminder to a candidate for the G. O. P. nomination, the ex-Legion commander would possess the same political charm - possession of a well-publicized Irish name.
These two men are possible contenders against Lieut. Governor Vernon J. Brown of Mason, long experienced in state affairs, at the June 18 primary. April 23 is the deadline for filing petitions.
In the Democratic party a wealthy manufacturer, George D. Schermerhorn was president of the Acme Chair Company at Reading, a town in Hillsdale county where he was born and raised. He served in World War I and is currently commander of the American Legion post in Reading. Reputed to be very well-to-do, Schermerhorn has a summer home on Mackinac Island and he owns several farms in Hillsdale county. Recently he informed his friends of his intention to buy "several more farms".
During the depression his furniture factory, employing from 20 to 100 workers depending on the season, paid low wage rates to employees. The plant is now unoccupied, however, although it has been shut down since V-J day because of the lack of supply.
His candidacy introduces a new element in the state party which has leaned heavily in recent years toward labor votes of industrial centers. The sales tax proposal, which would top off around \$5 millions from the state's revenue, is interpreted as a pocket book bid for the labor support.
