FARM FEATURES

COUNTY AGENT URGES USE OF CERTIFIED SEED

The highest dollar and cents re-
turn comes from good cultural
practices, planting of varieties that
are adapted to your locality and
soil, and the best seed available,
says Karl D. Bailey, county agri-
cultural agent of Oakland Coun-
ty. Warning that there should be
no waste of land this year to un-
proven varieties, inferior seed
and bad farming practices, the
county agent points to the need
for every pound of grain that can
be produced. "Europe is on the
verge of starvation, and what you
grow this year may make the dif-
ference between existence and
starvation for a number of people,"
Karl D. Bailey emphasizes.

With planting underway in some
sections, Bailey recommends Mar-
ion and Huron oats and urges that
certified seed be obtained.

As soon as the ground is ready
and oat planting is completed,
Michigan farmers will start barley
planting. Karl D. Bailey recom-
mends Wisconsin No. 33 or Bay as
adapted barley varieties and be-
lieves certified seed can be ob-
tained.

According to figures released by
the department of agriculture a
big spring crop acreage is needed
and specialists at Michigan State
college have learned in their work
throughout the state that Michi-
gan farmers will help support the
need of more oats and barley to
produce livestock. This will free
more wheat and corn for food and
export.

Commercial Fertilizer Samples Being Analyzed

Prospect for an early spring is
emphasized by the early move-
ment of Commercial Fertilizer.
Judged by the number of samples
received for testing in the State
Chemical Laboratories, reports
Charles Figy, director of the De-
partment of Agriculture.

Shortages and restrictions in
some basic fertilizer material,
coupled with scarcity of labor and
transportation facilities, are crit-
ical factors in the efforts of ferti-
lizer manufacturers to adequately
meet the farmers' and growers' in-
creased demands, in order to
stimulate production and the sup-
ply of farm produce.

Reports of an ever increasing
association from American agri-
culture is being met by Michigan
farmers in attempting to obtain
their seasonal requirement much
earlier than before.

"There will be no discrimination
of regulatory work," says W. C.
Geagley, State Chemist, "in order
that farmers shall be adequately
protected against any attempt to
introduce low grade or worthless
fertilizer materials."

The checking by fertilizer in-
spectors of materials offered the
public, and the collection and
chemical analyses of fertilizer
samples, will be continued and the
information made available in or-
der that only the recommended
grade of fertilizer be supplied to
growers.

WORLD'S NEW CHAMP MILK PRODUCER



IONIA, MICH. — With the production of 22,526 pounds of milk and
714.8 pounds of butterfat during the year ending February 1, Ionia
Ormsby Queen of the Ionia State Hospital farm has added the title of
world's champion milk producer to her 12 records, displacing Essex
Suzanne April Delle, who was announced as a new champion only last
November. The Holstein-Friesian cow's lifetime herd test record, over
a period of 15 years, shows the tremendous production of 552,563 pounds
of milk and 8,671 pounds of butterfat, with an average of 35 1/2 days
per lactation. Her highest individual record, at six years, shows 23,866
pounds of milk and 771 pounds of butterfat, milking three times daily,
365 days. Four of her records are over 700 pounds of fat and all over
500 pounds, with nine of her marks topping 20,000 pounds of milk.

Hormone Injections May Save Apple Crop

An actual "shot in the limb"
may prove to be "shot in the arm"
to Michigan's twenty million dol-
lar fruit crop.

Plant hormone injections are
being used in experiments con-
ducted by the department of hor-
ticulture at Michigan State college,
in an effort to retard blooming of
the apple trees to avoid their be-
ing caught by early May frosts.

"If the experiment is success-
ful," Dr. Charles L. Hammer, in
charge of the research, said, "we
cannot only retard the blossoming
and avoid frost kill, but the later
blooming will give the honey bees
a better chance to pollinize the
fruit because the insects will be
more active as the weather be-
comes warmer. Of course, the
project is strictly in the experi-
mental stage, but several years of
development may mean a great
saving to the Michigan fruit in-
dustry."

The early spring of 1945
very similar to the present season
brought about an early bloom
of the apple trees. "After being
slipped by May frosts the crop
brought slightly more than \$1,000,
000 as compared to average annual
value of nearly five times that
amount or \$20,000,000."

Hammer said applications of a
naphthalene acetic acid spray to
fruit trees before harvest time re-
tarded fruit dropage and that
trees treated in this fashion bloom-
ed slightly later the following
spring. On that basis, it was
theorized that injections of the
same hormone into the trees in
the spring might forestall early
blossoming. Hormone is being ap-
plied into wounds of the tree in
pastes and powders, applied as a
solution on the ground around the
trees and injected into the bran-
ches with a needle to determine
which method, if any, is the most
successful.
