At long last, conservation de-  
partment fish authorities have in-  
disputable proof that smallmouth  
bass may be taken on hook and  
line in winter.

Two bass caught by ice fisher-  
men early this month in Walleye  
Lake in Oakland County have been  
sent to the department's institute  
for fisheries research in Ann  
Arbor.

There had been rumors that  
smallmouth bass had been taken  
in Walleye Lake, also in Oakland  
County, and elsewhere in winter  
but it was only when Lee Anderson,  
in charge of an institute lake  
mapping party visited Walleye Lake  
that evidence was secured that the  
fish can sometimes be caught in  
deep water in wintertime. The  
bass — 10 and 12 inches in length  
— were caught on minnows at a  
depth of between 15 and 20 feet.

Fish authorities have believed  
that smallmouth bass hibernate in  
winter and there have been re-  
ports that the fish have been dred-  
ged up from resting places among  
rocks or in mud bottoms of lakes.

Walleye Lake fishermen declare  
that smallmouth bass bite more  
readily in winter than in summer  
in that particular lake.

**Patching Garment**

## WEST POINT MINISTER OUTLINES PLANS

Sunday morning, March 31st,  
the minister, Elder J. Scott Greer  
in an expository address based on  
1 Thess. 1st chapter, outlined what  
a modern church should be as to  
evangelic efforts. Special atten-  
tion was called to verse eight, in  
which the Apostle Paul commended  
the Thessalonians in writing,  
"For from you sounded out the  
word of the Lord not only in Ma-  
cedonia and Achaia, but also in  
every place your faith to Godward  
is spread abroad; so that we need  
not speak anything."

At a later session Rev. Greer  
made mention of his plan of op-  
eration in the West Point commu-  
nity. "We do not wish," said he,  
"to do our personal work for anyone  
to feel that we are 'imposing' or  
that we have an 'axe to grind' or  
even that we are competitive. We  
simply believe that the mission

of the Church is to seek and to  
save that which was lost—to help  
those who have no help and to  
serve where service is needed. As  
we go from house to house we  
do not wish to impress people  
wrongly as concerning our mis-  
sion. For instance, we need no  
help to 'build a church'—that  
work the Lord is doing—but  
rather that man has a need for  
the eternal God and His Christ.  
Arrangements were made by  
Charlie Wheeler, who has charge  
of physical equipment, for a gen-  
eral spring cleaning to be held at  
the church next Saturday, April 6.  
Instructions were given about  
bringing pruning shears, garden  
rakes, etc. Lunches may be served  
in basement for those living at  
a distance, for others this feature  
is merely optional.
