Sleeper state park and Island Lake recreation area are going to have group camp facilities this summer in spite of building material shortages, as the conservation department's parks division has decided to build them out of vacant barracks it already owns at the Waterloo recreation area, near Jackson.

Disamantling of a dozen of the Waterloo buildings will begin within a week, the parks division announced. The old barracks successively housed MCC crews, a military police training detachment and prisoners of war. They were built of five-foot sections that are readily taken down, transported and reassembled.

At Sleeper state park, near the tip of Michigan's "thumb," the barracks sections will be used in conjunction with mess hall and kitchen for 120 campers, a toilet and wash-house, a recreation building and tent platforms.

At Island Lake recreation area on the south side of the Huron River four miles east of Brighton, the group camps to be built consist of mess hall and kitchen, toilet and wash-house, a recreation building and 15 sleeping cabins to accommodate eight campers each.

Principal group camp users are children and youth organizations from Michigan's larger cities.

Spring fever that sends juveniles afflicted with 22 caliber rifles may get their parents into trouble, and the conservation department wants it definitely known that its off-season gun permits authorize no indiscriminate shooting.

The department has been issuing gun permits at the rate of 500 a week since the first of the year, many of them to returned servicemen for such legitimate purposes as target practice and the killing of crows and predators.

Small boys abroad after the

winter's confinement have been guilty of shooting at telephone pole insulators, bottles tossed into the river, songbirds and even windows of vacant buildings. Few of them, roaming the countryside with a gun permit, realize that, just as in hunting season, they must be accompanied by parent or other qualified older person until they pass their seventeenth birthday. Laws against trespass affect them just as strongly as in hunting season, also.

Conservation officers who find unaccompanied juveniles using firearms in a way to alarm suburban residents may hold the guns until the parents are interviewed. Older offenders may be prosecuted for careless use of firearms.

Whitmore lake in Livingston county, last of 13 chosen by the conservation department for a five year test of improving fishing by taking more of the annual fish crop, will be open to anglers after April 1. Liberalized regulations for a dozen other "experimental fishing" lakes have been in effect since the middle of March or the first of the year.

ly, Deik lake in Calhoun, Fine lake to Barry, Lobdel lake in Genesee and Pontiac lake in Oakland county. Whitmore lake will be open to some kinds of fishing this year around. But as in lakes north of Highway M-46, black bass, bluegills, pike and trout if any still will be protected in their respective closed seasons.

Dear lake in Hillsdale county and Saddle lake in Van Buren county are the same waters in a five-year test of replacing the number of underized fish by angling. Fishermen there may take as many as they wish of bluegills, sunfish, perch and rock and calico bass less than six inches long, in addition to established creel limits of legal-sized fish during the regular statutory seasons.

Four other lakes, Big Portage in Jackson county; File lake in Grand Traverse; Minnewaukinn in St. Joseph and Sugarloaf in Washtenaw counties, already have begun a five-year test of improv-

ing fishing by year around harvesting of bluegills and sunfish, in legal sizes and creel limits. In a class by itself is Birch lake of Cass county where a month and a half was added to the lake's open season, though trout, black bass, bluegills and pike still are protected during their closed seasons. On sections of Hunt and Fuller creeks in Montgomery county the effect of taking six-inch trout, an inch shorter than the usual limit, will be observed in trout season.

State fisheries men are keeping close watch over both the production and condition of the experimental waters to discover whether the more liberal regulations may be suitably applied to other lakes.




