### Like A Child . . .

with a new toy. This is the story that came out of Japan this week.

The Japanese people have been given a new individual freedom and like a new toy, they found it fascinating. For the first time they went to the polls and voted on a secret ballot for the public officials of their choice.

From all parts of the world came criticisms. "They weren't ready to vote yet." "It was stretching democracy too far." Yet they voted — approximately 65 to 70 per cent of those eligible voted. Like a child with a new toy? Yes, and with a toy that should never wear out.

And from Japan to Michigan, to Farmington, to every city and to every eligible voter in the United States comes a story — a story with a moral. We have a freedom, that through inheritance, has all but been forgotten. It is more than a toy, it is an obligation, a responsibility.

Maybe if it was a toy, a bright red shiny toy that captured our interest and held it, we would have less bickering, dissatisfaction and turmoil. From a standpoint of interest and responsibility, voting seems to resemble an old antique, stuck away in the barn to be forgotten.

It may seem a little early to talk about elections. It may seem a little late to talk about toys. However, if you want to fulfill your responsibilities as citizens, if you want to register your confidence or your protests, if you want to act when it counts, you will register, and you will vote. Not 30 per cent of you, but 70 per cent or better yet, 100 per cent of you.

The eyes of the world are upon you — you are democracy — you can make it work.

versus the OPA, or do we have inflation? Sounds like a soap box opera, or a one night stand.

It is, however, a serious problem facing every American. It is a fight for the necessities of life. A see-saw battle of prices against scarcities.

In spite of the OPA and its efforts to control costs of living by theory, we have inflation. No one has a quarrel with their efforts. Certainly it is an objective well worth striving for.

However, the OPA is working on a theory totally void of any semblance of realism. With a pencil and paper, and a column of figures the OPA has formed the economic policy of the country. Present cost of living standings are proof of their efforts. Is your dollar today worth a dollar? Currency fluctuates — but what makes it fluctuate?

Since time began, supply and demand has governed our economic system. It always will. Prices rise when products are scarce, and with increased prices come increased wages, and around it goes.

All the ceilings, all the stabilizing of wages doesn't hold down the cost of living. It only slows the processes of production and puts the blocks under the wheels of plenty.

Today the cost of living is up and in the greatest nation of the world we are without. Continual strikes, based upon the laboring man's need to meet the rising cost of living plague our production. With increased wages come higher costs.

If the OPA would throw away its pencils — put on their boots and learn from men who know what is going on in the field, they could lick the situation, foster production and put America on its feet.

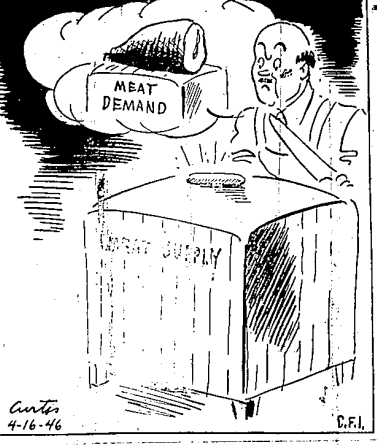
