OAKLAND COUNTY HOLSTEIN REAL MILK PRODUCER

If dairy cows in Oakland County had their way, there would be ample milk and butter for all. A Holstein cow on the Lakeland Farm near Clarkston produced 1167 quarts of milk, containing 128 lbs. of butter, in 28 days during May, according to George Fisher, Herd Supervisor for the State Dairy Herd Improvement Association. The milk had a value of \$100.63 at the farm.

This cow produced over 4 lbs. of butter a day, states Karl D. Bailey, county agricultural agent. The following farmers in Farmington Township are members of the County Dairy Herd Improvement Associations:

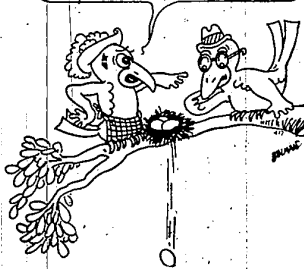
