Incumbent in the list of 906 candidates of degrees to be conferred at the annual Wayne University commencement exercises Thursday, June 13, in the Masonic Temple Auditorium, Detroit, are Judith Irvine Oates, candidate for the degree Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Arts, and Margaret Ann Barnes, candidate for the degree Bachelor of Science in Education. Both of the girls are graduates of Farmington High School.

Honorary degrees will be conferred upon Dr. Charles F. Kettering, Vice-President in charge of research, laboratories, General Motors Corporation, Doctor of Humanities; Dr. Edgar DeWitt Jones, pastor of the Central Christian Church, Detroit, Doctor of Letters; Miss Emille G. Sargent, director of the Detroit Visiting Nurses Association, Doctor of Science and Nursing; George W. Stark, city historian and conductor of the "Town Talk" column in the Detroit News, Doctor of Letters; and Dr. William W.
