"It's been a perfectly lovely life," she said. It's also been a hard life, she reflected, considering the mornings when she had to get up at 5 a.m., drive to the studio through the dark, drink coffee under the hair dryer, spend 45

minutes in makeup, and sandwich in calls to her cook with instructions about running her home for the day. They usually finished work about 7 p.m., and then it was time to view the rushes (the film of what they had been doing all day).

This was "where you could see your mistakes." This is a great advantage of films, according to Miss Fontaine, and makes a great school for acting.

One of the most important pieces of advice she was ever given in her career was, "Acting is simply thinking and feeling, and the rest will take care of itself."

Russian word that means "May God be with you," "Irene learned to recognize that word and took a tranquilizer when she heard it," her companion said.

NILA SAID she taught Mrs. Kampen the Russian words for "peace" and "friendship," and it was agreed that a nudge would mean it was time to say them.

The nudges were needed, she added, when the rented car ventured by mistake into a restricted area and on two occasions when the women were stopped and fined by Soviet police.
