Madonna Sisters Awarded Study Fellowships

Three members of the Madonna College faculty are among 33 recently announced winners of Kellogg Fellowships valued at \$7,500.

The awards, announced by the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities, will enable the recipients to pursue post-graduate study during the coming academic year.

The Madonna recipients are Sister Irene Louise Doman, assistant professor of journalism and coordinator of religious education programs; Sister Mary Michaellette Skurski, medical - surgical instructor; and Sister Kathleen Wolaczek, instructor of mathematics.

SISTER IRENE LOUISE will survey current teacher training programs and methods in religious education and Sister Mary Michaellette will do research at the University of Michigan on the use of trigger videotapes as an instructional technique in nursing to effect behavioral change.

Sister Kathleen's project is a study of computer science at the University of Pittsburgh.

AICUM PRESIDENT John L. Gaffney of Lansing said, "The fellowships are part of a three - year, faculty - development program for AICUM schools under a \$375,000 grant from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation of Battle Creek."

"Other phases of the faculty development program include summer seminars and workshops," held during the school year.

"It is the second year that fellowships have been awarded to faculty members from institutions that are members of AICUM," Gaffney said.

During the current academic year, 32 faculty members from AICUM colleges are engaged in post-graduate study and research. Six of the 32 are studying at institutions in England and Germany, while the other 26 are taking post-graduate courses on campuses from Massachusetts to California.
