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Clinton Scouts Seek Camp Building Funds

A goal of \$788,000 has been set by the Clinton Valley Council of Boy Scouts of America, in a camp development fund drive. More than 14,500 Oakland and Macomb counties' youth currently enrolled in the area's 355 scouting units.

The target was announced by Wallace W. Edwards, president of the scout council's executive board, and John G. Goense, general chairman of the capital fund drive. Said Edwards: "In 1965 the Clinton Valley Council purchased 2,300 acres of land at Lost Lake near Clare that was formerly the estate of Harry Bennett. The land, forest and lakes are not enough by themselves."

"Lost Lake Scout Reservation needs troopites, sanitary facilities, a beach, aquatic facilities, scoutcraft shelters, a chapel, campfire areas and other facilities."

YEAR-ROUND campouts and long term summer camping will be featured at Lost Lake. Plans call for two major campsites, each having 12 troopites that will accommodate up to 4,000 boys who will be attending summer camp. Wood Creek Camp will be expanded this coming summer. A new Cedar Bay Camp has been authorized and should be under construction by 1973.

Camp Agawam, the well-known 50-year-old campsite near Lake Orion, will be re-modeled and enlarged as a training and activities center. It will be the scene of Explorer co-ed activities, inner-city functions, a community meeting facility and a leadership training site as well as a day camp for Cub and Webelos Scout activities.

Gifts can be made in the form of a memorial, a tribute or as a three year pledge with the payment spread over a four year tax deductible period.

John A. Riley, vice president of The Pontiac Press, has been named major gifts chairman with a goal of \$453,000 to be raised through subscriptions in excess of \$5,000 each. This division will solicit industry, foundations, business, utilities and individuals with the potential for the larger gifts.

CO-CHAIRMEN of the scout family division will head a team of 2,100 volunteers and have a goal of \$200,000. The co-chairmen for the two county area are George R. DeCoursey,

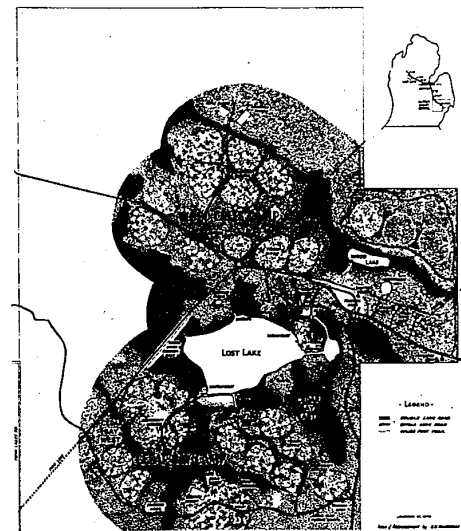
