NOGGLE TO JOIN WAR CRIMES STAFF IN EUROPE

Announcement is today made of the appointment of Mr. Donald O'Niel to the staff of Justice and H. Jackson, United States Supreme Court Justice in charge of war crimes prosecution in the European Theater, with headquarters at Nuremberg, Germany.

Mr. Noggle received his appointment through the War Department early this spring and is now awaiting sailing orders for himself and family. He will be temporarily assigned to military accommodations in Nuremberg until such facilities now under construction are completed.

Embarcation will be from New York in the early part of August and upon arrival at Cherbourg, France will proceed to a processing center to receive tutoring in military law and procedure. He is expected to begin his trial duties in September. The appointment is for one year with the reservation of his services for a longer period if needed.

"I am anxious about this wonderful experience," Noggle said. "It is an opportunity that comes only once in a lifetime, especially since there will be occasions necessitating visits to France, Switzerland, England and possibly Sweden and Finland."
