AMERICAN FARMER NEARS PORT

The ship, which was in collision with a vessel in the North Atlantic last Wednesday, was abandoned by the crew. International controversy arose when a tiny British ship, the Elizabeth, put a salvage crew aboard and attempted to tow her to port. A sister-ship of the American Farmer, the American Ranger, came upon the scene, took charge of the vessel and cut off the Britisher's tow line. Later, with pumps going and steam up, the American Farmer resumed her journey to port under her own power.

day.


Little Kathleen Harris of St.

Michigan Provides Non-Ser-
viced Connected Emergency Hospital
Service for World War II Vets

The State of Michigan through
the Office of Veterans' Affairs
provides a program of emergency
hospitalization for World War II
veterans. The questions and
answers below may clear up some
points concerning this program.

Q. What constitutes an emergency?

A. An emergency is considered
to exist when the lack of im-
mediate hospitalization would seriously
endanger a veteran's life or health.

Q. What should a veteran or his
family do in an emergency?

A. Contact the local veterans'
counselor who will make all ar-
rangements.

Q. Where can the veteran be
hospitalized?

A. In any approved hospital in
his home community if one exists;
otherwise in a nearby hospital se-
lected by the veteran's physician.

Q. What services are made
available to a veteran who qual-
ifies for emergency hospitalization
under the Office of Veterans' Af-
fairs' program?
